### Dinners for Seven or Eight

GPC welcomed Gettysburg C.A.R.E.S. guests December 29 through January 11 from 8:30 each evening until 7:00 the following morning. The number of guests ranged between 16 and 24, with most nights above 20. Six children came regularly with their moms. The Sunday School rooms on the lower level served as sleeping quarters, and the MacAskill Room served as the common area to enjoy a hot cup of coffee, a magazine, and some fellowship. Our guests were grateful for the chance to come in out of the cold and sleep in a warm and safe place. One elderly woman was brought in by the police because her home had no heat for two nights and she had nowhere else to go.

Once again this year, a number of people gave generously of their time and energy to help the shelter run smoothly. Church sexton, Tracey Stone, went above and beyond, keeping the classrooms and bathrooms clean and rearranging furniture and other equipment when they were needed for other purposes. Kathy Kircher showed up each night to turn on the lights, open the doors for the volunteers, and fill the hot water pot before the guests arrived. 
## **Young at Heart** **February 12, 2015 at 12:00 Noon**

## Per Capita

Have you ever noticed the odd envelope labeled "PER CAPITA APPORTIONMENT" found near the front of *your offering envelope* box? Like many members of GPC, you may have wondered, "Exactly what is per capita?" Per capita is an amount of money per member (\$25.05 for 2015) that our congregation pays to our larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). This money is part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together as a connectional church and links the individual church, presbytery, synod and General Assembly. Some of the money supports the administrative expenses of the whole church, of which GPC is a part. A major portion of the per capita is used for mission. The breakdown of GPC's 2015 per capita share is shown in the table.

2015	Total Per Capita - \$25.05	Mission Dollar %
General Assembly	\$7.07	20%
Synod	\$2.20	0
Presbytery	\$15.78	80%

At the presbytery level, mission spending supports Camp Krislund, international missions in Honduras, Haiti and Lithuania, and Lend A Hand, a disaster response ministry. Through the Presbyterian Mission Agency, PC(USA) supports global missions. The current call to mission is focused on three critical global initiatives:

- [Evangelism](#): Train leaders for community transformation
- [Global Poverty](#): Quality education for one million children by 2020
- [Reconciliation](#): End violence against women and children

The Session is requesting that each member consider making a special offering of \$25.05 per member this month in the envelope provided as their share of GPC's per capita to reduce the impact on the regular offerings that support the annual budget.



## New Fellowship Hall Doors are In!




When you enter our Fellowship Hall, you'll notice new doors!


