Report to the Congregation From the Capital Campaign Building Committee


There has been substantial activity by the Committee since its inception earlier this year. Much of that initial activity involved getting projects in progress to take them to completion. Here is a listing of projects that have been completed or are in the process of completion.

- Wall Street Property – The church was successful in obtaining ownership of the property and demolishing the buildings. We hoped to be able to have limited parking on the property; however, the Borough of Gettysburg informed us no parking would be permitted until code requirements were met. We are in the process of obtaining information related to those code requirements.
- Roofing contracts for a new roof on the Sunday School Building and repairs to the Fellowship Hall roof have been signed and should be completed prior to winter. Roofing contractors have been back-logged due to the harsh weather experienced this past winter.
- Contracts have been signed for removal of the old boiler system and installation of a new heating system. That work is underway at present. Although it is not a highly visible project, it will be greatly appreciated when the heating season begins.
- The sound system in the sanctuary has been upgraded and new hearing devices have been acquired. Again, not highly visible; however, we are now benefiting from this important upgrade.
- Ten new tables have been purchased for the Sunday School rooms and will be in use when Sunday School convenes in September.
- 263 new chairs have been purchased. 180 of those chairs are for Fellowship Hall and other locations in the church where needed. 75 chairs have been located in the MacAskill room. 8 other larger chairs are located in the Crane Library, in the church office and possibly a few in the MacAskill room.
- Construction of a portico entrance way for Fellowship Hall – This project has been designed by our architect, approved by the Historic Architect Review Board and Borough Council. Permits have been obtained and the project is currently being bid by several contractors. Those bids are due in early September. It is our desire to complete this project prior to the winter season. It is probably the largest and most expensive of all the projects on the capital spending list.
- Quotes for new computers for all staff are currently being obtained.
- Replacement of banquet tables for Fellowship Hall are under review.
- Other projects are under initial discussion which will be added to the list as funding is available.

We are pleased to report that all projects to date have been funded through the generosity of the congregation in support of the Capital Campaign conducted last year. As those Capital Campaign pledges are received, we will be able to continue completing those items on the project list.





Coming Soon! *New and Exciting for Everyone!* **2014 Fall Small Group Study**

Join us for an exciting study of *The Bible Jesus Read*. This book challenges the perception that the New Testament is more important than the Old and that the Hebrew Scriptures aren't worth the time they take to read and understand. Philip Yancey, with his candid, signature style, unfolds his interactions with the Old Testament from Moses to the Psalmists' turbulent emotions and the Prophets' oddball rantings. He reconnects for us the strong chords that bind the Old and New Testaments and reclaims the Reformers' deep sense of unity between the two. Most important, he says, reading the Scriptures that Jesus so revered gives believers a profound new understanding of Christ, the Cornerstone of the new covenant. “The more we comprehend the Old Testament,” he writes, “the more we comprehend the New Testament and the more we comprehend Jesus.”

According to Publishers Weekly, Yancey is an astute author who challenges Christians' assumptions without alienating them. The New Testament was written after Jesus' earthly ministry, making the Old Testament “the Bible Jesus read.” This obligates Christians to know it well. Yancey's lucid style and honest handling of difficult ideas ensure that readers will not be disappointed in this book.

In baptism we promise to walk alongside youth in the hope they will one day confirm their faith in Jesus Christ as Lord & Savior. Within the Presbyterian Church, confirmation-commissioning is the formal step for youth to publicly identify their life's focus as a Christian. This class seeks to give youth in grades 10 (and any youth in 11 and 12 who have not participated in the class) an open forum to discuss their faith in preparation to unite in membership with the GPC family.

Students will discuss topics such as: What is the church? What is worship? Who is God? Why are God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit important for Christians? Rev. Nyiri will teach most of the classes, with Rev. Wright and other teachers teaching some classes as well.

The class will meet Sunday mornings along with the whole 9th-12th grade Sunday School class from 9:30 - 10:30 a.m. in the Youth Room. Over the course of the 34 weeks you will read more than 70% of the Bible through a chronological movement of the Bible story.

Previous groups have told me that this program opened their eyes and minds to Scripture in a way that they didn't believe was possible. The benefit of this knowledge helps in all future studies and also builds leadership for those who complete the study.

The study guide gives you selected passages of Scripture to read each day for five days. Then one of the days you will read the material in your study guide. Then in a small group discussion you will talk about what we have read and see how it impacts our lives today as well as in biblical history.

Disciple aims at transforming, not just informing you as you examine Scripture, to put ourselves under the power of God's Word and to be changed by God's Word. Study guides will be required and can be ordered through me at the cost of \$40.
