Spending Some Time with John

Last Sunday we began a preaching series in the gospel of John. While the other three gospels share a lot of material in common, John is different from the other gospels, and gives us new perspectives and insights into Jesus. For example, only John tells us the story of Jesus and the woman at the well, the woman taken in adultery, the conversation with Nicodemus, and the raising of Lazarus from the dead. He omits the parables of Jesus, the stories about Jesus' birth, and the institution of the Lord's Supper!

This will be a challenging series for Lou and I to preach, and I hope you'll try to be here on Sunday as often as you can! You will probably also find it helpful to read the passages in advance. I've listed the first few passages below. So, come to worship and meet Jesus as John describes him!

Quarterly Financial Update

Since we have already finished one quarter of the year, the Long Range Financial Planning Team thought it might be a good idea for the Treasurer to provide a brief synopsis of the church's finances.

With 25% of the year under our belt, our income was \$198,601.79, or 25.06% of our total budget of \$792,375. Our expenses were \$180,648.82, 22.80% of our total budget.

We ended the month of March with a surplus of \$31,565.

Last week the treasurer met with the two elders responsible for Missions and the result of that meeting is that approximately 29% of the 2018 mission budget will be sent out very soon.

Another important note is that the church has paid its annual per capita assessment by the Presbytery of Carlisle in the amount of \$17,731 and that is always a very significant expense to the church.

In conclusion, we have had a good start to the year and I want to say "Thank You" to the members of this congregation for their continued faithful financial stewardship.

Application/information sheets are available in the narthex and Fellowship Hall.



Presbyterian Women's Birthday Offering



In 2018, three projects will receive funding through the Birthday Offering. Your gift will allow PW to provide funding to the following:

> Cottage Village, a Tiny-house Community for Low-income residents in Cottage Grove, Oregon Cottage Village will provide quality, affordable housing and a safe, structured social community for individuals and families with low or very low incomes. This Birthday Offering grant will be used to help build 13 tiny houses and a central shared-use area that will serve as a compassionate and protective community for vulnerable rural citizens.

Village of Grace Center for Physical and Spiritual Health, Tegucigalpa, Honduras

This Birthday Offering grant will make it possible for the Presbytery of Honduras to purchase the Village of Grace Center for Physical and Spiritual Health. Originally established by Presbyterian mission co-workers, the retreat center will be managed by Presbyterian women in Honduras. It will offer international hospitality for retreats, workshops, and mission teams from the PC(USA), Solar Under the Sun and Living Waters for the World.

The Dwelling Place, Minneapolis and St. Paul, Minnesota

The Dwelling Place was established in 1998 to provide for the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of women and their children following their escape from a violent partner. Transitional housing, education, food, clothing, trauma-informed support services, programming and mentoring for women are all part of the mission. This Birthday Offering grant will help The Dwelling Place purchase a vacant lot where they will construct a multi-use building with spaces suitable for large and small group programming, one-on-one case management, safe living space and staff offices. With the additional building, The Dwelling Place will be able to serve even more women and children who are seeking safety.



The National Fire Protection Association reports there are well over a million structure fires in America each year, thousands of which occur in church buildings (where arson is a leading cause of such fires). To protect lives and property, fire doors are part of the design of public buildings such as ours. Fire can better be contained in one section of the building when fire doors are closed, especially those to stairwells. All such doors have emergency hardware to assure safe exiting, and closure again afterwards. Keeping these doors closed is a wise safety precaution, not simply to deter fire from "getting through," but to stop fresh air flowing to feed a fire. Did you know that 50% of deaths in structure fires are to people who are not in the fire's originating room? Please help us to keep people safe and to limit possible property destruction by not leaving fire doors propped open. Thank you.

Your Email Please!


Ever feel disconnected?

Vacation Bible School June 11 to 14
