Two years ago I sent a photo of two children whose mother had passed away. The grandmother took care of the children, two girls and one boy. I gave aid for one of the girls to start kindergarten and the other to continue in 3rd grade. Unfortunately, last year in the month of August, the grandmother passed away. From the aid that was given me, I paid for the burial.

Also in that same year (2017), in the month of November, one of my brothers was run over by a vehicle. I used the funds for his burial. I am always supporting projects for the children of the church in which 45 children are fed. We also assist orphan children.

For this year, my goal is to reach those who are alcoholics. Some of them have come to the Lord thanks to the outreach. And we want to give support to wives and children of alcoholic husbands and fathers.

I give thanks to the church for the support it has given, which is not in vain. We want to continue the service and with the church's help it is possible. From Honduras I always pray God bless the church and family, and for God to provide the aids which are given.

Disciple Bible Study Offerings

Have you thought you would like to get deeper into Scripture? Would you like a small group study of various passages in the Bible? If you answered yes, then you may want to consider joining a Disciple Bible Study beginning in September. There are several offerings for you to consider...

<u>Sunday Evenings from 5 – 7 pm is "Remember Who You Are"</u> which is an in-depth study of the prophets and letters of Paul. This class meets weekly from September 9th thru May 19th. The facilitator is Marion Lambert-Hollowell. Study manual is \$40.

Monday Mornings from 10 - 12 am "Remember Who You Are" which is an in-depth study of the prophets and letters of Paul. This class meets weekly from September $10^{\rm th}$ thru May $19^{\rm th}$. The facilitator is Cheryl Betts. Study manual is \$40.

Monday Mornings from 10 – 11:30 "Disciple Fast Track – Old Testament" will be offered. This is a 12-week study for busy people just like you who seek to gain a better understanding of the Bible and want to grow as disciples. This class meets from September 10th through December 3rd. The facilitator will be Bob Bigham. Study manual is \$16.00.

<u>Tuesday Mornings from 10 – 12:00 "Disciple – Becoming Disciples Through Bible Study"</u> beginning Disciple study covering 70% of the Bible over 34 weeks. This class meets from September 11th through May 14th. The facilitator will be Merida Hurkett. Study manual is \$40.

Online Giving - A New Way of Donating to Your Church

At GPC we are always trying to think of new ways to make the donation process easier, and we recently added one more method of giving to the church: ONLINE GIVING.

Please note: You will need to have a cell phone that accepts text messages or a computer with email capability before using the online giving module.

Go to the church website, www.gettysburgpresbyterian.org and on the right hand side of the first page is a paragraph that references online giving. Click on the highlighted word to reach the first screen. You will then simply follow the prompts for the amount you wish to donate, which fund you want the money to go to, Tithes and Offerings or Missions, and then a series of screens where you will provide personal information.

You will be asked to provide a cell phone number or email address to which will be sent a special PIN, which is the security feature that allows you to make a secure donation. You will also be given an option to make a One Time Donation or a Recurring Donation.

This system allows you to use a debit or credit card or your bank account. You get to decide the method by which you want to donate.

Once you hit the "Submit" button, you will receive a confirmation email.

The entire process takes just a few minutes and is completely safe.


