Clergy Sexual Abuse

Dominating local news last week was the report of the Grand Jury regarding the sexual abuse of over 1,000 children over seven decades by 300 Roman Catholic priests. The scope of this tragedy is truly mind-boggling, and the complicity of the church hierarchy in protecting the predators is horrific. Further, the emotional and mental health toll on these children (who are now adults) cannot be measured. Some of you know this kind of toll firsthand.

Unfortunately, the sexual abuse of children is not only restricted to the Roman Catholic Church. It is found in Protestant churches, public schools, sports programs, music programs, scouting groups, and everywhere that predators can exploit children for their own gratification. It is a grim confirmation of our Presbyterian belief that sin is a powerful force that is found everywhere.

Disciple Bible Study Offerings

Have you thought you would like to get deeper into Scripture? Would you like a small group study of various passages in the Bible? If you answered yes, then you may want to consider joining a Disciple Bible Study beginning in September. There are several offerings for you to consider...

Sunday Evenings from 5-7 is "Remember Who You Are" which is an in-depth study of the prophets and letters of Paul. This class meets weekly from September 9^{th} thru May 19^{th} . The facilitator is Marion Lambert-Hollowell. Study manual is \$40.

Monday Mornings from 10 - 12 "Remember Who You Are" which is an in-depth study of the prophets and letters of Paul. This class meets weekly from September 10^{th} thru May 19^{th} . The facilitator is Cheryl Betts. Study manual is \$40.

Monday Mornings from 10 – 11:30 "Disciple Fast Track – Old Testament" will be offered. This is a 12-week study for busy people just like you who seek to gain a better understanding of the Bible and want to grow as disciples. This class meets from September 10th through December 3rd. The facilitator will be Bob Bigham. Study manual is \$16.00.

<u>Tuesday Mornings from 10 – 12:00 "Disciple – Becoming Disciples Through</u> <u>Bible Study"</u> Beginning Disciple study covering 70% of the Bible over 34 weeks. This class meets from September 11th through May 14th. The facilitator will be Merida Hurkett. Study manual is \$40.

DivorceCare

Divorce and separation are painful and stressful, and people going through them can feel very isolated. DivorceCare is a nationally recognized, 13 week, faith-based support group that meets weekly to help people experiencing separation and/or divorce face the many challenges facing them. Each meeting incorporates a video seminar with top experts on divorce and recovery, followed by time spent as a group discussing the video and talking about the challenges that the members of the group may be facing.

The next cohort at GPC begins Sunday, August 26th from 5:30 to 7 in the Eisenhower Lounge, and will meet every Sunday for 13 weeks at the same time. The groups will be facilitated by Dr. Susan Tassin and Leslie Casteel, and require pre-registration. The cost is \$15, and includes a workbook.




<u>Early Choir</u> – Meets for rehearsal every Sunday morning at 7:40 in the Choir Room on the 2nd floor across from the balcony. We sing at the 8:15 service. As we only have 30 minutes to practice, generally, the anthems are a bit easier. We sing three Sundays a month from September thru June generally.

11:00 Adult Choir – Meets for rehearsal Wednesday nights from 7 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., singing at the 11:00 services and for special events. We sing a mixture of classic and contemporary choir anthems throughout the year (Sept.-June). On occasion we will present special services and perform major cantatas and master works. We will be doing a special "Lessons and Carols" service on December 23 and we hope to sing John Rutter's "Requiem" for the 2019 Maundy Thursday service. Again, reading music is not a requirement. This group also sings generally 3 Sundays a month.

FIRST REHEARSAL for the 11:00 choir is Wednesday, August 29, 2018, 7:00 to 8:30. Both Choirs will begin singing on Rally Day, Sunday, September 9, 2018.
