- We have four paid staff members who assist with visitation and calls in both chronic and acute situations: myself, Rev. Lou Nyiri, Rev. Nancy Davis, and Phyllis Dowd. We meet each Tuesday morning and assign calls and visits to each of us.
- Our 12 Deacons make visits and calls, and provide meals, transportation, and other assistance to our members. Pastor Lou provides staff support for our Deacons.
- Our Stephen Ministry program provides oneon-one support through the ministry of active listening to those who would benefit from such a relationship.
 Pastor Lou provides staff support for our Stephen Ministers.
- Our "Write from the Heart" ministry writes notes of encouragement throughout the year to members. If you'd like to get involved with this ministry, contact Mary Ann Remaley.
- Various church members provide practical and prayer support at their own initiative. We are grateful for each one of you!

The dates of hosting Gettysburg C.A.R.E.S. (Combined Area Resources Emergency Shelter) have changed this year. GPC will serve as the host church February 4-17, 2019.

This is a cooperative project where several area churches provide homeless residents of Gettysburg with a warm place to sleep from October through April. Homeless residents come to the church at 8:30 p.m., stay overnight, and go to the Soup Kitchen the next morning to start their day with a warm breakfast.

CHRISTMAS IN JANUARY

Every Christmas we celebrate God's Greatest Gift, Jesus. Jesus lived a perfect life of service, was crucified, and rose from the dead to proclaim that nothing, not even sin and death, can separate us from God's living presence.

The Holy Spirit has given each of us unique gifts that God uses to help others see and experience Jesus' love. Many of us, however, have never unwrapped or discovered our spiritual gifts. That's why our congregation is offering the course, *Discovering God's Vision for Your Life: You and Your Spiritual Gifts*.

Now you can sign up and embark with others on a journey of discovery and ministry in a weekend course developed by Dr. Kenneth C. Haugk,

founder of the Stephen Series system of lay caring ministry and the author of many books, including the best-selling *Christian Caregiving--a Way of Life*.

This course is biblically based and answers questions such as these: To whom are spiritual gifts given? What is the purpose of spiritual gifts? How can I be sure that I have a particular spiritual gift? What does the Bible say about each spiritual gift? What is the difference between the fruit of the Spirit and the gifts of the Spirit?
