# Heads Up on Gettysburg C.A.R.E.S.

The dates of hosting Gettysburg C.A.R.E.S. (Combined Area Resources Emergency Shelter) have changed this year. GPC will serve as the host church from February 4-17, 2019. The host arrives at the church by 8:00 p.m. They will provide drinks for the residents, lead a brief devotion, help clean up and leave by 10:00 p.m. At that time, the church doors are locked and overnight volunteers spend the night with the residents.

This is a cooperative project where several area churches provide homeless residents of Gettysburg with a warm place to sleep from October through April. Homeless residents come to the church at 8:30 p.m., stay overnight, and go to the Soup Kitchen the next morning to start their day with a warm breakfast.

If you have not already participated in this local mission, a 90-minute training session is required. Upcoming sessions are scheduled at St. James Lutheran Church for Nov. 19, Jan. 14, Feb. 25 and March 18 at 6:30 p.m.. They are held in the church library.

There is a need for both welcoming hosts during the two-week stay at GPC and for overnight volunteers during that period at GPC and throughout the cold months at other area churches. Additionally, GPC will provide transportation with the church van to the Great Conewago Presbyterian Church as they host homeless guests from March 4-17, 2019. We need volunteers to sign up for that as well. It involves transporting homeless residents over each evening and returning to bring them back to the Soup Kitchen each morning. #### STEPHEN MINISTRY

HOW DOES STEPHEN MINISTRY WORK?

When someone requests a Stephen Minister, our Stephen Ministry Referrals Coordinator will meet with that person, explain what Stephen Ministry is, and help determine whether Stephen Ministry is the kind of care that person needs. Our Referrals Coordinator then matches that person with one of our available Stephen Ministers. The Stephen Minister will then call that person and begin meeting with him or her for about an hour each week as long as the need is there. Everything a care receiver says to his or her Stephen Minister is kept confidential. The Stephen Minister doesn't try to solve problems; rather, he or she listens, cares, prays, and helps the care receiver find his or her path to healing and wholeness. It was in 1888 when Eliza Clokey of Springfield, Ohio, urged each woman to give one dollar over and above her usual contribution to the Women's General Missionary Society of the United Presbyterian Church of North America. They were credited with saving the worldwide missional movement of the Presbyterian church at that time. The 2018 Thank Offering grants have been awarded to organizations that will provide opportunities for the people they serve to grow in self-esteem, hope, freedom and economic stability. They will help build peace, provide rehabilitation services, and promote self-empowerment in the areas of health, shelter, nutrition and education. # News from Bryan & Emily Gerlach, our missionaries in Thailand:

**Eden** arrived at 11:19am on Sept. 2. She was 2.8kg (6lbs 4oz) and is doing great. The birth went smoothly and quickly and we had a really positive experience at the hospital here in Chiang Mai. Eden means paradise and is very easy for our Thai friends to pronounce, although in Thai it's pronounced more like *Aiden*.
