


HEIFER INTERNATIONAL

CHRISTMAS IN JANUARY

Every Christmas we celebrate God's greatest gift, Jesus. Jesus lived a perfect life of service, was crucified, and rose from the dead to proclaim that nothing, not even sin and death, can separate us from God's living presence.

The Holy Spirit has given each of us unique gifts that God uses to help others see and experience Jesus' love. Many of us, however, have never unwrapped or discovered our spiritual gifts. That's why our congregation is offering the course, *Discovering God's Vision for Your Life: You and Your Spiritual Gifts*.

Now you can sign up and embark with others on a journey of discovery and ministry in a weekend course developed by Dr. Kenneth C. Haugk, founder of the Stephen Series system of lay caring ministry and the author of many books, including the best-selling *Christian Caregiving--a Way of Life*.

This course is biblically based and answers questions such as these:

- To whom are spiritual gifts given?
- What is the purpose of spiritual gifts?
- How can I be sure that I have a particular spiritual gift?
- What does the Bible say about each spiritual gift?
- What is the difference between the fruit of the Spirit and the gifts of the Spirit?

We have scheduled a weekend retreat on January 18th evening and January 19th. The cost of materials is \$17. Look for a sign-up sheet in Fellowship Hall.

Note from Dori Hjalmarson

Villa Gracia: The retreat center just outside of the capital city of Tegucigalpa has successfully come under the direction of the Presbyterian Women of Honduras, and we are less than \$4,000 from our fundraising goal. The center was purchased in part with a grant from the Birthday Offering of the Presbyterian Women of the PC(USA). I accompanied Honduran PW Vice-Moderator Nora Palma to the Church-wide Gathering in Louisville, as well as to Northwest Arkansas and to Tampa Bay, Florida, to network and learn about ministry partnerships and other camp and conference centers in those places. What a whirlwind trip, and so fruitful! Nora and I returned feeling inspired and energized about the possibilities at Villa Gracia. Since March, the retreat center has hosted more than two dozen groups, about a third from the PC(USA), about a third from other denominations in Honduras, and about a third from inside the Honduras Presbyterian Church. It has become a center of gathering, of learning, and of women's leadership. The Honduras Mission Network continues to raise funds to complete the purchase of the property and make needed renovations and upgrades, such as plumbing and furniture. Migrant caravan

Major news this month has been the caravan of Honduran migrants making their way towards the U.S. We in Honduras have been saddened and pained to hear the characterization of migrants as dangerous criminal invaders, and of Honduras as a bleak and hopeless place. On a personal note, I ask you who know and love Honduras to humbly consider how you can encourage your family and friends to reconsider their presumptions about Hondurans, about Central America, and about migrants in general. The people migrating north are human beings, and I pray that their safety and dignity may be recognized and preserved. Politicians in both the United States and Honduras are attempting to make them something less than human.

Looking to future

I have been talking with several people in Honduras and the U.S. about the need to grow the Honduran church's capacity for partnership in mission. We have been inspired and challenged by the Honduras church's efforts to step up and participate financially in projects like Villa Gracia. We want to build on the success of some long-standing friendships, such as that of the West Chester, Pa.,-Honduras youth partnership, as an example of a covenant of equals. We want to foster sustainable models of mission. Alex Rodas and I have started developing some plans for workshop training of congregational youth leaders. We hope that you'll all join us in taking a look at your partnerships and considering how they can be more sustainable and more fulfilling for all the various parties involved in them.

This month we will complete the two-year cycle of theological education with Universidad Bíblica Latinoamericana. The Honduras presbytery will be meeting with Tracey King-Ortega, and professors Nidia Fonseca and Karla Koll, to discuss possibilities for continuing the program into next year and beyond. Several students are already adapting the curriculum for use in their own congregations, and several students who began the program half-way through wish to complete the certificate. The presbytery is discussing how to make this partnership more economical and most beneficial to church leaders.

I'll be in the U.S. visiting family Dec. 18-Jan. 3.

This has been a wonderful year so far. Thank you for your prayers, presence, gifts and service. Thank you for your support and partnership in the Honduras mission.
