—Melody Beattie



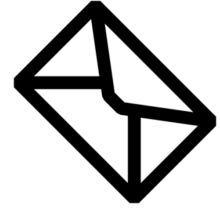

PROCLAIM CHRIST'S PEACE: 2018 PEACEMAKING OFFERING



"So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near..."
-Ephesians 2:14-17

The letter to the Ephesians tells us that Jesus came to proclaim a universal peace. While the earthly ministry of Jesus occurred in a specific age and place, the peace he shared is limited by neither time nor geography. As followers of Christ, our call to work for peace begins in our own neighborhoods and extends to the ends of the earth. It is a demanding call, but one that Presbyterians at all levels of the church are seeking to follow.

Each September GPC holds a specific fund drive dedicated to support our mission spending. This year we will be receiving this offering on Sunday, September 30, 2018. Your contribution will support the following ministries, divided equally:

Soup Kitchen – serving between 70 to 80 meals a day; now serving 7 days a week.

Survivors, Inc. - helping women and families escape the cycle of domestic violence, sexual assault, and trafficking.

Homeless Shelter – offering temporary living space and help with planning for more permanent housing for individuals and families who are homeless.

Food Pantry – providing groceries for more than one thousand people per month.

Mission of Mercy – local mobile health clinic providing medical & dental services to individuals without medical coverage.

Presbyterian Mission Organization – to support the larger effort of peacemaking throughout the world.

What kind of king and what kind of kingdom are we asking for when we pray the prayer Jesus taught us to pray? A study of the Old Testament – Joshua through Esther – enables us to see the kingdom of God not only as it once was, but also as it is now, and as it will be one day. Over the ten weeks of guided study (5 in fall and 5 in spring), we will trace the history of the people of God from the time they entered the promised land through a series of failed kings, exile, and finally their return to await the true King. Get inspired!
