Reproduction

In a recent article about American Chestnut trees, Sara Fitzsimmons noted that because millions of Chestnut trees remain in this country, they are not considered endangered. However, she regards the species as "effectively extinct" because it "no longer performs what a species is supposed to do- continue its survival through reproduction." By that definition, the Christian faith in the US and Europe could be regarded as "effectively extinct" for the same reason. We are not reproducing new Christians!

Adult baptisms are rare in most of our churches, attesting the fact that few adults are coming to faith. In addition, many of our young people leave church when they become young adults, and relatively few return later in life. Why is this, and what can we do about it?

There are a number of factors that contribute to the problem, and I'll deal with some of them in my sermon this Sunday, "Raising Christian Kids in a Secular World." I hope it will spark important conversations in our homes and here at church- conversations that are essential if we are not to continue down the path to "effectively extinct."

Per Capita

The envelope labeled "PER CAPITA APPORTIONMENT" found near the front of your offering envelope box is a special offering that is not used by GPC. Per capita is an amount of money per member (\$27.10 for 2019) that our congregation pays to our larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). This money is part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together as a connectional church and links the individual church, presbytery, synod and General Assembly. Some of the money supports the administrative
