What is a Faith Community Nurse? What services will I be offering to GPC?
I will be working for you the parishioners, and support the well-being of the GPC membership and community members.
I will be promoting health and wholeness in the name of Jesus. I will be providing spiritual, social, and emotional care.
Health Counselor: Listen and speak with persons regarding their health issues. I am available to visit in the hospital, Nursing facilities, and homes as needed. Offer my presence and prayer during times of crisis and celebration.
Advocate: I will assist you with any health related needs and interests. I can accompany you to your Dr's appointments (to be your eyes and ears) and help you to understand any test results, medications, etc. so that you can make informed decisions. (Confidential) I can review your discharge instructions, medication lists, etc. to ensure you have a good understanding.
Health Educator: I will be providing Health information and awareness about chronic conditions or diseases. I will be emphasizing preventative care through educational opportunities, screenings, etc. (Blood pressure screening Sundays, First Aid kits, etc.)
Resources: I will work to link congregation members to community/spiritual resources, and work alongside the Stephen Ministers and Deacon Ministry at GPC.
Spiritual Presence: Work with the GPC pastoral care team in the care giving ministry of GPC by listening, praying, supporting, and encouragement through personal visits, telephone calls, etc.

I am not available for invasive/hands on skilled care or to provide medical diagnosis, or fill pill dispensers (but I can observe you do this task).
