What are we doing to **Promote Local Justice?**

There were some questions regarding what our church does to promote justice locally after Pastor Dave's sermon on this Christian Virtue. Actually, in an effort to promote community justice, there are quite a few local mission activities we're involved in.

For example, we participate in providing shelter for the homeless in two ways: By hosting the homeless in our church for two weeks as part of **Gettysburg CARES** and providing transportation. This year, our host dates are December 22-January 5. Our commitment is to provide facilities and hosts each evening. Additionally, many GPC members stay the entire night. There is training at St. James Lutheran Church in the fall for anyone who wants to become involved. We also provide van drivers and transportation to the Great Conewago Presbyterian Church when they host the homeless. GPC members also reach out as overnight volunteers at various other churches throughout our community from October through April.

GPC has been a **Covenant Church with Habitat for Humanity** for more than 25 years. Our church members serve on the board and volunteer to help build Habitat houses. The most recent home is located next to NAPA Auto Parts on Middle St. and the new owners have comfortably moved in. Bob Remaley is our contact.

Once a month, GPC provides soup for lunch at the **Gettysburg Community Soup Kitchen**. Additionally, our church members volunteer to work at the soup kitchen and serve on the board. Interested volunteers should contact Merida Hurkett.

Each year, GPC sponsors the **Dr. Robert Curtis Peace Essay Contest**, "What Can I do to Promote Peace Eternal in a World United?" Seniors at Gettysburg High School compete for first and second place essays and are given cash awards each year by Margaret Curtis at the annual school scholarship night.

GPC members volunteer for **The Gleaning Project of South-Central PA**, a wonderful way to get some fresh air, enjoy the beautiful countryside of Adams Co. and pick fruit and vegetables for those in our community who are dealing with food insecurity.

In the late summer and fall, as migrant workers move into our communities, we participate in the **Adopt-a-Camp Migrant Ministry**. Ours is located on Potato Road, just west of Bendersville. We meet them at their camp, provide warm blankets, sweatshirts and toiletries, and get to know them through visits. In addition to adult church members, our youth group pitches in to build relationships while these workers are many miles from their homes and families.

Each year GPC members volunteer for bell ringing at the Salvation Army's fundraising event at Walmart during the holiday season.

GPC Presbyterian Women organize a Rummage and Bake Sale twice a year to benefit the PW Fund as well providing reasonably priced used items to our local community. Amy Deitch is our contact.

Carpenter's Gift reaches out to community members who need help in home repairs. GPC members volunteer their skills in carpentry, painting, roofing and general labor. Kevin Hollowell leads this project.

Our church periodically provides bag lunches for **Mission of Mercy**. Founded in 1994, Mission of Mercy seeks to assist those uninsured and underinsured in our communities with health care, dental care and prescription medications.

We have GPC volunteers and board members serving the local community through Ruth's Harvest, a ministry that provides elementary school children with nutritious food over the weekends during the school year. They sort, shelve and pack food items weekly that are sent home with students each Friday. We also collect food items regularly to support this program.

Through regular church offerings and the **Annual Peace Offering**, GPC provides funding for many local community activities as well. Some include: Ruth's Harvest, Adams Rescue Mission, Adams Co. Homeless Shelter, Lend a Hand, Adams Co. Prison Chaplain, Fruitbelt Farmworkers Ministry, Carpenter's Gift, Habitat for Humanity, Gettysburg CARES and God on the Ground.

Each month church members contribute to people and local organizations in need through the Calendar of Giving. Each monthly organization is posted on the bulletin board and the tub is located next to the elevator. Just drop your items in the tub.

Lend-a-Hand, in the planning stages for this fall, is a one-day activity that reaches out to those in need of home repairs or fall cleanup. It's designed for individuals or families and will consist of basic home repairs as well as fall clean-up activities such as leaf removal, gutter cleaning and other preparations necessary for the winter months. Volunteer tasks, providing the gift of time, talent and love, will be both skilled and non-skilled.

As Pastor Dave said in his sermon, "To follow God means to treat others compassionately and justly." If you haven't already, why don't you try one or more of these local missions?



There will also be opportunities for sharing prayer requests and lots of fellowship and fun!


We can always use volunteers to help with the food and welcoming people.

Keeping children "in the loop" regarding a disease is so very important & this book allows that conversation to begin with age appropriate statements & questions provided. By beginning conversations, ground can be prepared for more emotional discussions regarding the impacted person & teaching life lessons. This excellent resource is now available in your Adult Library for anyone to check out.
