Recently, the Presbyterian Church's Office of Public Witness released a statement critical of the Trump administration's new rule affecting Legal immigrants in our country who are seeking permanent status. It would penalize those who have used any public services including food stamps, Medicaid, or housing assistance- services that poor people seeking safety here are likely to need when they first arrive. I don't always agree with our denomination's stand on current issues, but I thought this statement from Rev. Jimmie Hawkins, who directs the Office of Public Witness was right on target for those who seek to live out biblical Christianity:

"The Trump administration's new rule concerning immigrant persons attempting to legally migrate to the United States is one of the most un-Christian actions of any administration in decades. This new rule would radically alter the criteria for acquiring legal status and citizenship and harm the ability of the most vulnerable

to find a place in our society; it is one of the most cold-hearted endeavors imaginable. It is beyond the pale that immigrant persons with legal status in the US could now be denied permanent status because they have legally used public benefits. It is the poor, the impoverished, the hungry and the starving for whom we as a nation, and as people of faith, are called to embrace and welcome. It is with the strongest condemnation that we stand in firm and determined opposition to any actions put forth by this administration to implement such a rule. As a Matthew 25 church "We Choose Welcome" to those who are most in need."



Healthy Reasons to eat Fruit!

July is the time when fruit is plentiful at our local farm markets or backyard. I love getting fresh fruit to eat with a meal, a snack, or in my favorite recipes. Here are some fun facts:

Cherries: Cherries help to calm your nervous system, and are full of fiber and antioxidants. They are one of the sweetest fruits.

Grapes: Grapes help to relax your blood vessels. Grapes have antioxidants, vitamins, and minerals. Grapes are very low in calories and zero cholesterol.

Apricots: Its orange color explains its richness in vitamin A, essential for the health of the eyes and the skin. Apricots have many health benefits, including the ability to improve digestion, relieve constipation, improve heart health and wounds, and reduce cholesterol levels.

Peaches: Rich in potassium, fluoride, and iron, peaches are also known for their antioxidant role and excellent for the skin thanks to their high vitamin A content.

Watermelon: This fruit helps to control your heart rate. Watermelon has a high content of water vs. nutrients. Watermelon is 90% water. If you are on a fluid restriction diet, be cautious!

Strawberries: Strawberries potentially fight cancer and aging. They are low calorie because of their richness in water, while being very nutritious. Among the most represented nutrients: vitamin C which makes them one of the richest fruits in vitamin C.

Mangoes: They help to protect against several kinds of cancer. They are particularly rich in vitamin C and antioxidants, which makes them beneficial against diseases and premature aging.

Blueberries: They are low in carbohydrates, antioxidants, and rich in water, Vitamin A and potassium.

Blackberries: These tart-tasting berries contain antioxidants and manganese.

Plums: They are higher in calories than most fruits but have healthy benefits! Plums have fiber richness that help to prevent episodes of constipation.

Tomatoes: The good news is "it's the beginning of the full season of tomatoes"! They are rich in water, low-calorie, and rich in nutrients!

Calling on you to create a 2019 Advent Devotional.

"New and Renewed Life About Our Journey of Faith"

Written by congregants of the Gettysburg Presbyterian Church – Advent 2019.

Dates needed are December 1 – December 25 (25 devotions)

Who can participate? Anyone who wants to share their stories or thoughts on their Christian journey. How do I sign up? We will have a signup sheet at Sunday coffee hours – or you can email Cheryl Betts at gpcdce@gettysburgpresbyterian.org or Lynne Graziano at lynnegraziano@gmail.com or call her at 404 226-4742.

What is the deadline? The devotion must be submitted by November 8, 2019

How long should my devotion be? Roughly 350 – 450 words; one-page single spaced (ideally Arial 12-point font – but we can do that).

What is the format for the devotion? Devotions will be similar to those in many traditional devotionals, such as Our Daily Bread. We suggest this format:

- ~ A title
- ~ A short scripture verse or verses that relates to your story or idea
- ~ Two to four short paragraphs describing what new life or renewed life means to you. This can be a story, a poem, or just a shared thought or two.
- ~ A short one or two sentence prayer

So what can I write about new and/or renewed life?

As Christians, we have all entered into new life with our faith commitment. It is a life in Christ, lived out in faithfulness to him and the things he taught us. Jesus was born as a baby, fully man and fully divine – Immanuel – God with us. Many of us were raised in the church and have always known the stories and life guidelines in scripture. Some of us came to faith as a youth, or an adult, and became a new believer in Christ. In Matthew 18:3 Jesus tells his disciples and audience, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven."

Think about your faith journey. When did you feel new or young in faith? When did you understand the grace and love of a God who sent his own son to be born, so that we could live forever. Or maybe you don't remember the "new" days of faith, but can recall a moment or time when your faith was renewed, revived, or recharged. This could be a church moment such as confirmation, or bringing your own children to church. It might be when you volunteered and saw faith in action, or went on a mission trip and served the less fortunate. Every day we can be new in Christ!

As you think about the Christmas story, and Christmas experiences in the past, reflect on new life, faith, hope, and love. Think about Mary's faith, and how a young, unmarried woman changed the world through her faithfulness.

You are free to use any scripture verse(s) that are meaningful, but some that might spark ideas include: Acts 5:20; Romans 6:4; Ezra 9:9; Romans 7:6; Colossians 3:1; 2 Corinthians 5:17; Psalm 119:88;

Donating to a Charity using a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

If you are age 70½ or older, IRS rules require you to take required minimum distributions (RMDs) each year from your tax-deferred retirement accounts. This additional taxable income may push you into a higher tax bracket and may also reduce your eligibility for certain tax credits and deductions. To eliminate or reduce the impact of RMD income, charitably inclined investors may want to consider making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD).

A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from an IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity, as described in the QCD provision in the Internal Revenue Code. Amounts distributed as a QCD can be counted toward satisfying your RMD for the year, up to \$100,000, and can also be excluded from your taxable income. This is not the case with a regular withdrawal from an IRA, even if you use the money to make a charitable contribution later on. In this scenario, the funds would be counted as taxable income even if you later offset that income with the charitable contribution deduction.

Why is this distinction important? If you take the RMD as income, instead of as a QCD, your RMD will count as taxable income. Having higher taxable income can directly impact your eligibility for certain deductions and credits. For example, your taxable income helps determine the amount of your Social Security benefits that are subject to taxes. Keeping your taxable income level lower may also help reduce your potential exposure to the Medicare surtax.

Am I eligible for QCDs?

In prior years, the rules that permitted QCDs required reauthorization from Congress each year, and those decisions were sometimes made late in the calendar year. With passage of the Protecting Americans from Tax Hikes (PATH) Act of 2015, the QCD provision is now a permanent part of the Internal Revenue Code. This means you can plan your charitable giving and begin reviewing your tax situation earlier each year.

Tip: With the 2018 tax law changes, there's 1 additional factor to consider: you may take advantage of the higher standard deduction (\$12,000 for single filers, \$24,000 if married and filing jointly). This means that if you claim the standard deduction, you won't be allowed to itemize things like charitable donations. However since QCDs are not deductible, they can remain an option for your charitable giving, even if you claim the standard deduction in a given year.

The Rules of QCDs

A QCD must adhere to the following requirements:

- You must be at least 70½ years old at the time you request a QCD. If you process a distribution prior to reaching age 70½, the distribution will be treated as taxable income.
- For a QCD to count toward your current year's RMD, the funds must come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline, which is generally December 31 each year.
- Funds must be transferred directly from your IRA custodian to the qualified charity. This is accomplished by requesting your IRA custodian issue a check from your IRA payable to the charity.
 You can then request that the check be mailed to the charity, or forward the check to the charity yourself.

Note: If a distribution check is made *payable to you*, the distribution would NOT qualify as a QCD and would be treated as taxable income.

• The maximum annual distribution amount that can qualify for a QCD is \$100,000. This limit would apply to the sum of QCDs made to one or more charities in a calendar year. If you're a joint tax filer, both you and your spouse can make a \$100,000 QCD from your own IRAs.



- The account types that are eligible for QCDs include:
 - Traditional IRAs
 Inherited IRAs
 SEP IRA (inactive plans only*)
 SIMPLE IRA (inactive plans only*)
- Under certain circumstances, QCDs may be made from a Roth IRA. Roth IRAs are not subject to RMDs during your lifetime, and distributions are generally tax-free. Consult a tax advisor to determine if making a QCD from a Roth is appropriate for your situation.
- Certain charities are not eligible to receive QCDs, including donor-advised funds, private foundations, and supporting organizations. You are not allowed to receive any benefit in return for your charitable donation. For example, if your donation covers your cost of playing in a charitable golf tournament, your gift would not qualify as a QCD.

Tax filing for QCDs

A QCD is reported by your IRA custodian as a normal distribution on IRS Form 1099-R for any non-Inherited IRAs. For Inherited IRAs or Inherited Roth IRAs, the QCD will be reported as a death distribution. You should keep an acknowledgement of the donation from the charity for your tax records. Please consult a tax advisor to learn more.

For a better understanding of how QCDs can affect your taxable income, let's consider a few hypothetical scenarios. Phil has been taking RMDs for the past few years, but this year he has decided to make a QCD. Phil did not make any non-deductible contributions to his IRA, so all of his distributions would be taxable:



If you are 70½ or older, own an IRA, and donate to charity, QCDs may make sense for you; consult a tax advisor regarding your specific situation.
