A New Partnership with Meritus Health in Hagerstown, Supports Pam Phillips in Her Role as Faith Community Nurse

We're pleased to announce a new partnership with Meritus Health in Hagerstown. Meritus has supported faith community nursing and parish nursing programs in our region since 1996. Gettysburg Presbyterian Church is their newest faith-community partner as they support Pam Phillips in her ministry. Some other local partners include St. Mary's and St. Rita's Catholic Church in Fairfield, Otterbein Church in Waynesboro, and Wesley Chapel and Rouzerville United Methodist Churches. In addition, Meritus partners with over 50 faith communities in Washington County, Maryland and Jefferson County, West Virginia.

The partnership provides practical support for Pam with continuing nursing education opportunities along with ready-made health education ideas and resources. The monthly networking meetings allow for exchange of ideas and contacts with other nurses who are serving in this role. Since faith community nursing is a specialty practice in nursing, recognized by the American Nurses Association, keeping updated with professional practice guidelines is essential. A day retreat is planned this year to encourage spiritual growth and an annual parish nurse and clergy luncheon is hosted every spring.

The Parish Nursing Program Manager at Meritus is Wendy Zimmerman, RN, who has been involved in faith community nursing since it began in the Mid-West with the Rev. Dr. Granger Westberg in Illinois, in 1987. The partnership between GPC and Meritus is informal and there is no cost. Pam has access to the resources of local parish nurse network and in return she is asked to provide her program statistics (number of blood pressures taken, number of hours of service, number of referrals, etc.) on a quarterly basis. Program statistics from all the partnering congregations are tabulated annually and support the community outreach and population health initiatives of Meritus Health. It's inspiring to see how Jesus' example of teaching, preaching, and healing, come to life, through this modern day ministry of health and wholeness.

#### **Hidden Dangers In the Home**

We all can benefit from these safety measure tips:

Handrails: they are essential inside and outside of the home.

**Doorknobs vs Lever handles**: Lever handles are easier to use if you have arthritis or difficulty using your hands.

**Lighting**: Increase the wattage, use 3- way bulbs in your fixtures. Use floor lamps to cast better illumination for reading and writing. Use nightlights in the hallways and bathrooms.

#### **Bathroom suggestions:**

Install raised "toilet seats" to provide ease. Use a shower chair (we have some here at GPC) or install a "walk in" shower if you are remodeling your bathroom. Install grab bars in tubs, showers, and bathrooms.

#### Household areas:

Remove scatter rugs. They are pretty but are a hazard in the home and increase your risk of falls.

Use a low profile and or non-skid mats. Keep stairs uncluttered and clear. Consider anti-slip treads for hardwood stairs.

#### A Different Way of Donating

We offer the use of ACH technology for members who desire to make their contributions to Gettysburg Presbyterian Church via an electronic method other than BillPay, which many of you already do. ACH stands for Automated Clearing House and the system operates by the member authorizing GPC to make an automatic draw from their bank account, similar to having your electric, gas or phone bill automatically debited from your account.

The real advantage to the members of the church is that once you authorize an amount and frequency, it will become an automatic debit for whatever length of time you specify. You do not have to write a check or put it in an envelope or bring it to church.

### The Aero Energy House of Worship Program

Help Us Donate to Your Church.

Small donations from a committed congregation make a difference.

The Aero Energy House of Worship Program is a donation program established by Aero Energy to provide Aero Energy customers an opportunity to give to their churches. If 100 Aero Energy customers from our congregation sign up to participate, our church could receive an annual \$3,000.00 donation (based on 750 gal/year average fuel use per participant).

#### **COMMON QUESTIONS:**

- 1. If I become a House of Worship Program participant, will I pay more for my fuel?

  No, you pay the same price per gallon you're paying now. This is a donation from Aero Energy to the church. Aero Energy donates 4 cents for every gallon of fuel you use, that is all.
- 2. Does my church need to use propane gas or heating oil to receive the donation?
- 3. Does my church need to be an Aero Energy customer in order to receive the Aero Energy House of Worship Program donation?

No, but they are welcome to use Aero Energy and receive four cents in donations for every gallon of fuel they use.

#### **Security Plan**

As you know, GPC recently adopted a security plan, and observant people have noticed our special cadre of volunteers helping to ensure we all stay safe during worship times. But the laity also has a part to play, and you should know what your responsibilities are. In simplest terms, if there were to be an emergency, you would be told one of two commands: Shelter in place, or evacuate.

First, what is "shelter in place?" It means that if you're in a regular room, you close and lock any doors, turn out the lights, and sit **quietly** along the same wall as the door is located so as not to make yourself a target to anyone peering in. Many of our rooms have now been equipped also with special door stops. Using these, you take the long piece hanging behind the back of the door, and fit it into the unit at the bottom of the door and the receptacle in the floor so that the door can't be moved. These are very secure and won't let anyone in.

If you're in the sanctuary or Fellowship Hall, shelter in place is a little different. Those in the sanctuary should do their best to take refuge under the pew. People in Fellowship Hall, if unable to safely get outside or to another room, should use any cover which they can to be out of sight, and stay mostly along the wall opposite the closets. If possible, secure the doors there as well.

Evacuation is completely different, and much more simple. If told to evacuate, exit by the nearest door and proceed along High Street, eastward, towards the Gettysburg Borough offices. Go to the **far** side of the building and congregate in the driveway there.

It's vital to note that children MUST STAY with their Sunday School teachers. Also, **under no circumstances should parents try to retrieve their children.** Just go to the designated area on the other side of the Borough building, and await reunification there.


Knowing these procedures and being prepared to follow them will make all the difference should an emergency ever arise. Please read this several times to become well-acquainted with what you need to do.

GPC will be offering classes in Basic Life Support (BLS) and lay level First Aid, CPR and AED. They will be held on Wednesday, October 23 as blended learning in the Sewing Room. This means you will get to do half of it online at your own timing, and then the skills in classroom. For registration, or if you have questions, please call Becky Stabler, 717-688-5183. This provides 2 year certification from the American Red Cross.
