Migrant Camp Christmas Dinner with GPC Youth Groups

On December 15 the GPC youth groups invited migrant workers from the Potato Road camp to join them at their annual Christmas Dinner in Fellowship Hall. While only two workers were able to attend, two youth members, Lydia Casteel and Jay Tassin, from GPC made an extra effort to make them feel at home by sitting with them at dinner and interacting with them about their experiences in Adams County as migrant workers. Dr. Melanie Finkenbinder, a board member with the Fruitbelt Farmworker Christian Ministry served as interpreter and Bill Tindall drove the van to the camp to pick up and return the men to their camp.

While the purpose of Adopt-a-Camp is to make the workers feel at home while living temporarily many miles from their friends and families, interacting with Hilder and Migual became a blessing for us as well. Before they left, Dr. Finkenbinder interpreted our question to them, asking if there was anything we could do to make their stay more comfortable. Because some in the camp were new to Pennsylvania's cold winters, a bit different from their homes in southern Mexico, they suggested warm coats and blankets. The next Sunday we solicited help from the congregation. Not surprisingly, GPC members rose to the occasion with 7 winter coats, a winter vest, 8 stocking caps, a sweat suit, 1 cozy blanket and a sleeping bag.
