- Second, an important part of what mission trips do has to do with us! Our view of the world is enlarged as we engage with people from different races and places. We develop friendships both within our mission team and with the people we serve. I have treasured Christian friendships in Mexico that go back over 30 years! And many who go find a spiritual impact on their own souls.

So I continue to support hands-on mission trips, and I hope you will, too! You can go on a trip, which I would encourage you to do. You can give to support a trip. And, you can pray for our trips. I hope you'll do your part to support this aspect of mission work at GPC this year.

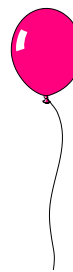

Lesson 6: Exodus 20:14; Genesis 2: 18-25; John 8:1-11



Adult Elective Sunday School Class - January 5 thru February 16th

When was the last time you read the book of Matthew? We will be reading and studying it together in January and February at 9:30 in the MacAskill Room.

We will be using a book by John L. Hiigel – *Partnering with the King* – to study the book of Matthew. This will be a facilitated study with Lynne Graziano and Susan Kolmer. No need to read the book to participate – we will read portions of it together! For extra credit – start reading the book of Matthew prior to class.

Per Capita

The blue envelope labeled “PER CAPITA APPORTIONMENT” found near the front of your offering envelope box is a special offering that is not used by GPC. Per capita is an amount of money per member (\$27.20 for 2020) that our congregation pays to our larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). This money is part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together as a connectional church and links the individual church, presbytery, synod and General Assembly. Per capita amounts are determined by General Assembly nationally, regionally by the Synod and locally by the Presbytery. These monies are used to administer the responsibilities, functions, and mission of each governing body. A major portion of the per capita is used for mission.

Per Capita funding serves and resources your church as it:

- Maintains a physical office and staff at all three levels of governance.
- Provides training and leadership development for your church officers, learning opportunities for pastors and members of congregations, and faith formation initiatives for youth through Camp Krislund, Youth Triennium, and other special events.
- Supports the health and well-being of congregations with tools and guidance for congregations searching for a pastor, assistance with conflict resolution, as well as property issues, loans, insurance and record-keeping.
- Provides oversight and preparation for those discerning God’s call to ministry.
- Supports and directs the administration of your congregation's participation in mission funding and hands-on mission initiatives.
- Strengthens your congregation’s connections to the wider church through:
 - ◊ Commissioners elected to bi-annual General Assembly meetings,
 - ◊ Support of the Presbyterian Historical Society in Philadelphia, and
 - ◊ Participation in the life of the Church Universal, as we seek to work and live in fellowship with “all persons in every nation.”

The breakdown of GPC’s 2020 per capita share is shown in the table above. The Session is requesting that each member consider making a special offering of \$27.20 per member this month in the envelope provided as their share of GPC’s per capita to reduce the impact on the regular offerings that support the annual church budget. Thank you for your faithfulness in giving.
