2019 Coronavirus (2019-nCov)

The 2019 Coronavirus (2019-nCov) is a new virus that causes respiratory illness in people and *can spread* from person to person. The first outbreak occurred in Wuhan, China.

What are the symptoms of Coronavirus? Patients with 2019-nCov have reportedly had mild to severe respiratory illness with symptoms of fever, cough, shortness of breath. There is limited information about who may be at risk for severe complications but does include older adults and persons who have underlying chronic medical conditions, and immune-compromised individuals.

What is your role? Stopping transmission (spread) of the virus through everyday practices is the best way to keep people healthy. Each of us have a role in staying healthy by washing your hands, frequent cleaning of electronic equipment, doorknobs, surfaces, etc.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.

Gettysburg Presbyterian recommends: Consider greeting others in worship by nodding, smiling, fist bump, elbow tap, or wave hello to fellow congregants. Anytime you are ill, we encourage you to stay home, and livestream our services.

What do I do if I am sick? *Anytime* you are sick we encourage you to stay home. Always cover your cough or sneeze (with a tissue or into your elbow), throw the tissue away and wash your hands. Use soap and water for 20 seconds (at least) and if not available hand sanitizers (containing at least 60% <u>alcohol</u>).

GPC has hand sanitizing stations at the Baltimore Street and Fellowship Hall entrances to sanctuary as well as by the cookie table on Sunday mornings for your use.

If you are exhibiting symptoms of the Coronavirus: Seek medical attention immediately. *Call* your physician office and or Emergency Department *prior* to going to let them know of your symptoms and or recent travel and follow their guidance. Masks should only be worn if you are the person exhibiting symptoms.

Currently there is no specific antiviral treatment for 2019-nCov. The best way to prevent infection is to avoid being exposed to the virus.

You are invited! GPC Strategic Planning Information and Input Sessions

The GPC Strategic Planning Committee (SPC) spent the last year reviewing data, analyzing our church's strengths and growth areas, and reading *Canoeing the Mountains* and other material on 21st Century challenges to Protestant churches. To summarize, the road ahead of GPC is not the same as the path we have walked upon for centuries. Our world has shifted from one where Christian faith was the "norm" to one where the fastest growing group of "believers" are those with "none."

We are fortunate to be a large congregation with active and committed members interested in being both the "salt of the earth" and the "light of the world." We have "good DNA" that runs through our worship, our work, and our outreach to others. And we want to hear from the congregation as we move into the "strategies" phase of our work.

We have identified four main areas to identify strategies for sustainability and continued impact. They are: mission focus; targeted outreach; staffing realignment over the next few years; and revenue generation.

To share our yearlong journey with each of you and hear your feedback, we have established a series of one-hour information and input sessions designed to meet everyone's schedule. No sign up is required – just show up and join in. These include:

Sunday School Elective Lenten Series -

THE BOOK OF REVELATION: Prophecy of Doom or Message of Hope?

9:30 & 11:00 a.m. Led by DR. CHARLES (BUZ) MYERS

The Book of Revelation has always been a source of controversy. No book of the New Testament has received either such ready acceptance or such resolute rejection. In some Christian circles, the Book of Revelation is "the" book of the New Testament. These persons devote all of their study time to Revelation; they carefully examine every visionary detail to determine what the book reveals about contemporary events and future happenings. In other Christian circles, however, Revelation is the most ignored book of the New Testament. These persons perceive Revelation as an obscure writing that in fact reveals nothing. They believe it to be so incomprehensible that it is not worth the time or the effort to study.

For all Christians, however, the Book of Revelation is a source of confusion and misunderstanding. Even the title causes confusion, for this book, which contains a series of revelations and visions, takes its title from the first phrase of the work: "The Revelation" (in the singular). And this is only the beginning of the confusion! The fantastic imagery and the mythological language so characteristic of Revelation are constant causes of misunderstanding and misinterpretation.

In six Sunday morning sessions we will consider what is surely the most confounding and most controversial book in the New Testament. What is the central message of this widely read, oftentimes misread, and too often unread book? Is that message one that should cause anxiety in the present and fear about the future, or does the Book of Revelation offer a message of hope and encouragement? Come and find out as we study together under the leadership of DR. CHARLES (BUZ) MYERS from the Department of Religious Studies at Gettysburg College. The sessions are as follows:


For the seventh year in a row, The Gleaning Project is proud to present spring Empty Bowls and you are invited to attend.
