How can you help decrease the spread of the Coronavirus

- "Social distancing" or deliberately distancing yourself and others to avoid spreading illness by staying at least 6 feet away to decrease spreading of the virus. Social distancing is not disconnecting!
- Continue to wash your hands with soap and water (while saying the Lord's prayer,20 second rule)
- Use hand sanitizer with *at least* 60% alcohol if no soap and water available.
- Avoid touching your face
- Clean frequently used items including your phones, computers, IPAD, remotes, tables, countertops, doorknobs, steering wheels, etc. with disinfectant
- Do not bring items in (Groceries, Mail, purse, etc.) and "plop" them down on the counter without using a disinfectant afterwards
- Leave your shoes at the entrance way of your home

Reminder:

This is a time for Christians to shine with their faith! If you are like me, I need to hear some *positive* thoughts these days. You too can help spread good news. Now is the time to "sparkle" as a Christian showing your faith through your small acts to others, offering words of encouragement, and lending a hand to your neighbor. We as a church can continue to *reach out* to others even though the "doors" are closed. *Share* some of these key scriptures with your family, friends, neighbors.

Scriptures to provide comfort: 2 Timothy 1:7, Matthew 18:20, Isaiah 26:3, Philippians 4:6-7, Psalm 103:2-4, James 4:8, John 16:33, John 14:27, Luke 12:25-26

Consider what you have read by thinking it through and mediating on it.

Franklin Graham once wrote in his book, Living Beyond the Limits, "Fear cannot take hold unless it is fed". The same is true today. Center our lives on Christ and keeping the focus on HIM can calm our anxieties.

Philippians 4: 6 says "Do not be anxious about anything, but in *every* situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God"

Daily Suggestions: Who can I check in on or connect with today? What am I grateful for today? What can I do outside today? Look for the beauty of each day (take a picture and send to Rev. Lou) **AED (Automated External Defibrillator) Update:** We now have 1 set of *Child and Infant* pads along with *Adult* pads in the AED (Automated External Defibrillator) located outside the sanctuary door entrance. 
