"The Pastor's Page"

Emmaus

In Luke 24:13-35, two disciples are walking and talking in the days following Jesus' death and resurrection. They're trying to make sense of what's going on in light of recent events. Jesus joins them "but their eyes were kept from recognizing him" (v. 16). It is late in the day when it appears as though Jesus is going to keep walking; so, they urge Jesus to stay with them. Jesus sits to eat with them, and takes the bread, blesses, breaks and gives it to them – and their eyes were opened, they recognize him, and Jesus vanishes from their sight.

This is typical when eating with Jesus – the guest becomes the host. We think we are the hospitable ones when in fact it is Jesus who fills our deepest hunger and opens our eyes to the presence of new life around us. Like those two disciples, may we allow God's power to open our eyes that we would see new life around us. May we share our discoveries with the people who join us on this journey. Call or Facetime someone and invite them to sit at table with you as you walk, talk and eat together in this surreal time.

The following liturgy from *The Presbyterian Outlook* can be used to shape this conversation:

Read – Luke 24:13-35

Welcome Litany -

One: Come, let us gather around and see how the Spirit will nurture our faith today.

All: Who is with us?

One: Christ, the light of the world.

(Place a candle on a table in your gathering place and light it.)

All: Who is with us?

One: The Love of God, who came to meet us in the world.

(Place a cross on a table in your gathering place.)

All: Who is with us?

One: The Wisdom of God, who speaks through the Scriptures.

(Place an open Bible on a table in your gathering place.)

All: Who is with us?

One: The Grace of God, who proclaims we are children of God.

(Place a symbol of baptism – a bowl of water, a seashell – on a table in your gathering space.)

All: Who is with us?

One: Our risen Lord, who meets us at the table.

(Place a symbol of communion – a plate and cup, a loaf of bread, grapes – on a table in your

gathering space.)

One: We are here, Holy Spirit, ready for your leading.

God sightings and prayer offerings -

Invite each person to share where they saw or experienced God this week. Invite each person to share something — a person, community, experience, event, etc. – for which they want to offer prayer.

Closing Prayer -

Good and gracious God, we thank you for all the ways you were and are present in our lives and in the world. [Invite each person to say aloud the sighting they named earlier.]

We bring our prayers to you, prayers for... [invite each person to say aloud the prayer need they

named earlier]. In Christ's name we pray, Amen.

April 16,2020 was National Health Care Decision Day, Originally, I had plans for GPC to have a day dedicated to Advanced Care Planning. Due to the Pandemic, this has brought Advanced Directives to the forefront, Advanced Directives have become a heightened discussion due to COVID 19.

What is an Advanced Directive?

A written statement of a person's wishes regarding medical treatment made to ensure that their desires are carried out should they become unable to communicate them to a physician.

This term is used to describe documents that give specific instructions about future medical care and treatments. Advanced Directives can include: Living Will (not the same as a Last Will and Testament), Do Not Resuscitate Order, Withholding/Withdrawing Treatments and Health care agent/ Health Care Power of Attorney. A Health care Power of Attorney is different from a Financial Power of Attorney.

Why should I complete an Advance Directive?

This document helps physicians and family members carry out your medical wishes and mental health care if you are too ill to decide for yourself (unconscious, or too weak to verbalize)

Who should complete an Advanced Directive? Adults (18 years and older)

Steps to get started:

• Choose a Health Care Agent/ Health Care Decision maker.

Think about "who" you respect and best understands your desires. This person is the designated person who "speaks" on your behalf when you are unable to voice your wishes. They are the person who carries out *your wishes*.

• Who can be a Health Care Agent?

Your Health Care Agent can be a spouse, child, partner, significant other, friend, etc. It is a good idea to choose at least 2 Heath Care Agents /health care decision makers if one of them is unable to make decisions at the time you need their services.

• Ensure you have a conversation with the person you choose as your Health Care Agent so they know what your wishes are, do not assume they will automatically do it.

• Get your paperwork in order.

Obtain documents from your lawyer, primary care physician, or Pam Phillips RN FCN. Paperwork varies from state to state.

• Do not sign your Advanced Directives.

The most common requirement is that the document is signed by you and 2 witnesses (not relatives or persons who will be beneficiaries), in front of your lawyer, or a notary. The requirements vary from state to state.

What is a Living Will?

A living will specifies your wishes, your organ donation preferences, your treatment preferences, and your personal values, including your goals for end of life.

Living Wills may include:

- ~ CPR resuscitation (CPR): What do you want done if your heart stops beating and/or you stop breathing
- ~ Artificial Ventilation
- ~ Blood Transfusions
- ~ Hospital Transfer
- ~ Medical workup
- ~ Antibiotics (to treat infections)
- ~ Artificially administered Fluids and Nutrition
- ~ Dialysis (substitute for normal kidney function to purify the blood)

How often should I review my Advanced Directives?


I would encourage you to review your Advanced Directives annually. As we grow older, diseases occur, etc, our thoughts change regarding our end-of-life wishes. This review gives you an opportunity to make changes to your Advanced Directives. Ensure that you share your changes with your Health Care Agent/Health Care Decision maker, so they are aware of your current desires for end-of-life decisions.

Local Missions Update



Certainly, times have changed as the COVID-19 pandemic has taken front and center in most of our lives. Predictable systems that used to be in place regarding local missions have changed as well. GPC's Local Missions Team met via Zoom last Thursday evening in an effort to get a better understanding of what we can do as a Christian community, and more specifically, at Gettysburg Presbyterian Church.

The consensus of the group was that, because of CDC guidelines, actual volunteering in local mission activities is limited. However, the needs still exist and financial donations are recommended at this time. Here is a run-down of what the team reported after making calls to local mission organizations.

- The Office for Aging reported that current meal delivery teams are meeting needs previously met. They will keep us posted of changes or if specific requests are made.
- Ruth's Harvest is in need of financial support. Their distribution of food bags has doubled since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, because store shelves have been impacted by the pandemic, it has become more difficult to provide nutritionally balanced meals in the food bags they prepare. Financial support will provide the additional flexibility necessary to purchase the right foods.
- The Soup Kitchen prefers financial contributions as well.
- The Girl Scouts Blessing Box continues to be a readily available source of food and necessary supplies for local residents. There has been a steady stream of contributions into the box over the past few weeks as well as quick use by people in need. Please consider dropping off canned goods, boxed goods, feminine products, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo, bars of soap, lotion and wash cloths.
- SCCAP, located at 153 North Stratton Street, is able to accept donations for preparation of
 pre-packaged groceries being prepared for people in need. In particular, their current needs
 include: canned peas and mixed vegetables, hamburger helper, cereal and bread.
 These items can be dropped off at the SCCAP building where food is distributed from.
 Just drop donations off in the grocery cart outside the building to maintain safe social
 distancing.

Local residents in need continue to appreciate the generosity and caring of the members of GPC.

Tentative Dates (NOTE: THESE DATES ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE based on pandemic re-open &/or availability of youth/adult leaders):


Choice 1 – Week of June 21st (could be all or part of June 21-27) this keeps original week we had planned to go to NC

approach of reading stories of what Jesus said and did." We focus on Jesus himself by the ways they situate him in time and place.



How Prayer Requests are Being Handled During COVID-19

During these dis-concerting and dis-connected times, the words of Philippians 4:6-7 come to mind, "...in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

In following CDC recommendations to flatten-the-curve we discontinued in-person worship. In order to keep connected with our GPC family, our church leadership (Session, Deacons, Pastoral Care Team, Staff and Stephen Ministers) began making phone calls which has led to an increase in prayer requests. As we receive your prayer requests, we want you to know: 1) Your prayer requests are important to us; and 2) How your prayer requests are shared.

Prayer requests are shared in the following ways:

- 1. Prayer Team which confidentially prays for each request by name.
- 2. Pastoral Care Team which will follow up accordingly.

Sunday Morning Prayers may not always include specific names, however, prayer requests will be grouped under category headings (i.e. "We ask that you give strength to those in need of healing and wholeness") believing God knows each individual's name included in that prayer.
