



Facemasks vs Face Shields

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention has held firm in its recommendations on how we can protect ourselves and others from COVID 19.

We should stay 6 feet apart, wash our hands, and wear a face mask. Increasingly, epidemiologists are also recommending something new: add a Face Shield.

Facemasks can be surgical type or made of cloth (containing 3 layers) and cover the nose, mouth, and loops around the ears. According to the Mayo Clinic, a proper face mask filters out "large particles in the air," and has been shown to reduce the spread of COVID-19 by 85 percent.

Face shields may provide an additional layer of protection to those who are wearing them. Face shields are made of a piece of clear plastic that extends down from the top of the head, covering the mouth, nose and eyes (part of the body through which the coronavirus can also be transmitted). They do not provide filtering protection for breathing. They might be recommended for a person who is not able to wear a mask because of breathing issues. The purpose of the shield is to protect us from droplets being splattered in the eyes. Healthcare workers are now using these when seeing patients in addition to face masks in many venues including hospitals, doctor's offices, home care providers, Hospice providers, etc.

Welcome to our Seasonal Migrant Workers

Each year, GPC reaches out to our seasonal migrant workers in Adams County with **Welcome Kits** through the Fruitbelt Farmworker Christian Ministry. The camp, consisting of 40 men, is located on Potato Road, just west of Bendersville. We will be collecting throughout the month of August.

Look for the sign-up sheet and Welcome Kit notes that provides a line for your name (if you wish to include that). Also, since not everyone is attending church in person, contact me to get the necessary paperwork if that is more convenient. Bill Tindall: 717-357-1281 or agpr4you@yahoo.com This is an exciting opportunity to reach out during the COVID-19 pandemic in a local ministry which doesn't require physical contact.

The Welcome Kits should include: 1 adult toothbrush, 1 medium toothpaste, 2 bars of bath soap, 1 bath towel, 1 wash cloth, 2 rolls of toilet paper, 2 disposable razors and 1 can of shaving cream.

Either place the items in a paper grocery bag or, if necessary, in another container.

Completed Welcome Kits or supplies to make the kits should be placed on the table in Fellowship Hall.

Again, if you need them picked up at your home, feel free to call me. If you are comfortable in including your name, put it on the yellow **Welcome Kit** form. If you're feeling especially "frisky" sign on the Spanish version.

Special Note: Because of health concerns, we have not yet made arrangements to visit the workers at their camp on Potato Road. Watch for further details.




Homemade Facemasks Needed: Gettysburg Borough, Wellspan Health & Fruitbelt Farmworkers Christian Ministry (FFCM)

The Local Mission Team is seeking to provide an organized GPC response to meet the increasing need for facemasks. We hope to continue collecting facemasks to help residents stay healthy as we continue to protect ourselves against the coronavirus pandemic. Previously, we responded to Wellspan's request for Hand-Made-Fabric-Masks. We will now expand the effort to include the Gettysburg Borough and FFCM (migrant workers) requests for facemasks.
