
Gettysburg C.A.R.E.S. Update

Gettysburg C.A.R.E.S. plans to open on November 2 this year, according to Pastor Mike Allwein and Board President, Mary Stevenson. "We have had to make many adjustments to comply with the CDC Shelter Guidelines," they explain.

The biggest change is where the guests will sleep. Sadly, because of CDC/Covid 19 guidelines, C.A.R.E.S. will not be in the churches this year, but rather in local motel rooms. This will create financial challenges different from past years. More information will follow.

There are many details to be worked out, but C.A.R.E.S. has a new Program Director who will help do this. Rosemary Laureano will be joining as Program Director. She comes with many years of experience in a similar position in the healthcare field and was part of the WellSpan team that provided the C.A.R.E.S. Medical Clinic during the past four years. During November, Rosemary will begin intakes of homeless neighbors in the Gettysburg community. The shelter part of the program begins December 1 with plans to continue providing shelter through the end of March 2021.

The Peace Offering collection of \$1,840.00, made on September 27, has reached out in five directions as Sean explained it would during his presentation. One thousand dollars has gone to SCCAP to serve both the Food Pantry and Adams Co. Homeless Shelter. Five hundred dollars went to the Gettysburg Community Soup Kitchen, \$100 to Mission of Mercy and \$250 to the Presbyterian Church USA, Mission Organization.

Funds through all local charities were made through to Adams County Community Foundation's Giving Spree where the contributions were enhanced by the foundation.

Zoom Study

During this Pandemic, weight gain has become an issue for most of us. With the Holidays fast approaching a few reminders are listed below. *My goal* is to start afresh Now.



10 Ways to Eat Well

- Boost consumption of fruits and vegetables. Aim to eat four to five servings each of fruits and vegetables daily. Choose fruits and vegetables that are deep green, orange, yellow, and purple, since these have the greatest nutritional value. A serving is: one medium fruit, 1/2 cup canned or frozen fruit, 1/2 cup cooked vegetable, 1/2 cup fruit juice, and 1 cup leafy raw greens.
- Cook with olive oil as much as possible and use it to make salad dressings. Make a quick and easy dressing by combining 3/4 cup olive oil, 1/4 cup balsamic vinegar, 1/2 clove minced garlic, and 1 T each of chopped fresh parsley and chives. Virgin olive oil is best since it has more inflammation-fighting antioxidants than refined olive oil.
- Snack on walnuts instead of chips. Walnuts provide fiber, minerals, antioxidants, and the kinds of fatty acids that are good for your heart.
- Eat a whole grain cereal such as oatmeal for breakfast, and replace refined grains with whole grains, such as substituting brown rice for white rice.
- Eat fatty fish such as salmon two to three times per week to get more omega-3 fatty acids. Wild salmon has more omega-3s than farmed salmon. Try ground flaxseed and chia seeds
- Eat fewer fast foods. Many tend to be cooked in oils that contain trans fatty acids, which increase inflammation. If you eat at fast-food restaurants, order a grilled chicken sandwich or salad with vinaigrette dressing.
- Replace white potatoes with sweet potatoes. They're high in vitamins and delicious when baked with a little olive oil, garlic, and rosemary.
- Cut down on sugary drinks such as juice, soda, and punch. Try unsweet tea instead.
- Eat more lentils and beans. They are good sources of protein and can replace red meat at meals. Try black beans and brown rice sautéed with onions and garlic and seasoned with cumin.
- Munch on dark chocolate and fresh raspberries for dessert. Both are loaded with antioxidants.

There are a lot of scriptures related to food in the Bible. *To thrive spiritually is our goal*. When our bodies, values, and appetites are surrendered to God, we can make choices that lead to a healthier lifestyle.
