Gettysburg C.A.R.E.S. Update

Gettysburg C.A.R.E.S. plans to open on November 2 this year, according to Pastor Mike Allwein and Board President, Mary Stevenson. "We have had to make many adjustments to comply with the CDC Shelter Guidelines," they explain.

The biggest change is where the guests will sleep. Sadly, because of CDC/Covid 19 guidelines. C.A.R.E.S. will not be in the churches this year, but rather in local motel rooms. This will create financial challenges different from past years. More information will follow.

There are many details to be worked out, but C.A.R.E.S. has a new Program Director who will help do this. Rosemary Laureano will be joining as Program Director. She comes with many years of experience in a similar position in the healthcare field and was part of the WellSpan team that provided the C.A.R.E.S. Medical Clinic during the past four years. During November, Rosemary will begin intakes of homeless neighbors in the Gettysburg community. The shelter part of the program begins December 1 with plans to continue providing shelter through the end of March 2021.

Foods That Make You Go Zzzz

Thanksgiving is just around the corner. Visions pop into my head of my family sitting/laying around the living room *trying* to resist the urge to nap after eating a healthy portion of the traditional Thanksgiving Day meal.



Why do we feel sleepy after this meal? Tryptophan. Tryptophan is a component of the brain chemical serotonin, which gets converted into the well-known sleep-inducing hormone, melatonin. Tryptophan is one of 20 naturally occurring amino acids—the building blocks of proteins. Because the body is unable to manufacture tryptophan on its own, it **must** be obtained from food protein.

Any meal containing tryptophan and lots of carbohydrates trigger sleepiness. Poultry and many other foods also contain tryptophan. Our body converts tryptophan into melatonin and serotonin, which are thought to induce sleep.

Why not use foods like this to your advantage on other days (and nights) of the calendar?

If you experience the occasional sleepless night, the Mayo Clinic offers some insight on how certain foods can help you sleep.

Foods That Contain Tryptophan

Dairy foods (warm milk)

Oats

Bananas, Kiwi

Poultry

Chamomile Tea

Peanuts, Almonds, Walnuts

Try a light bedtime snack that is mostly carbohydrate with a little protein to improve your chances of a better night's sleep. This carb-protein combo may increase the availability of tryptophan to your brain.

Avoid Before Bedtime

- Too much protein (protein-rich foods also contain the amino acid tyrosine that stimulates brain activity)
- Heavy and spicy foods which cause heartburn
- Lots of fluids that require lots of bathroom breaks
- Alcohol which can cause less than restful sleep and frequent awakenings
- Caffeine which stimulates the nervous system. Keep in mind, this tactic can help with the occasional sleepless night, but make sure you visit your doctor if you are experiencing sleep problems on a more regular or frequent basis
