Here at GPC you see some of those gifts being exercised during worship on Sunday morningsinstrumentalists, singers, readers, teachers, preachers and other worship leaders. But there are some other folks using their gifts that you don't see- our tech team!

It takes 4-5 people to run the technical side of things to produce the livestream service you see. Carrie Conklin puts together the slides that are shown with lyrics, prayers, scriptures, etc. She, rotating with some volunteers, then shows the slides during the service. Sal Chandon, Shane Miller, and Jerin Firth run the sound. They have to mix the sound in one way

for the those in the sanctuary, and a different way for those who are watching at home. For example, the organ sound is sufficient by itself in the sanctuary, but needs to be picked up on a microphone and fed into the sound that goes out on-line or you wouldn't hear it! Finally, Mark Wherley coordinates the visual images from our four cameras.

I thank God for these members of our tech team, who use their gifts and abilities so that we can enjoy worship together each Sunday! Maybe you can find a way to thank them for their service!



Stephen Ministry

HOW DOES STEPHEN MINISTRY WORK?



When someone requests a Stephen Minister, our Stephen Ministry Referrals Coordinator will meet with that person, explain what Stephen Ministry is, and help determine whether Stephen Ministry is the kind of care that person needs. Our Referrals Coordinator then matches that person with one of our available Stephen Ministers. The Stephen Minister will then call that person and begin meeting with him or her for about an hour each week as long as the need is there. Everything a care

receiver says to his or her Stephen Minister is kept confidential. The Stephen Minister doesn't try to solve problems; rather, he or she listens, cares, prays, and helps the care receiver find his or her path to healing and wholeness. For more information call Lou at the church office 334-1235.

The Deacons of the church are charged with assisting members of our congregation with finding rides to medical appointments. We realize not everyone has the same level of comfort in doing routine tasks as they had before the coronavirus, but with the introduction of vaccines, we would like to see if we can expand our list of possible drivers. I have much to share with you, so I've organized it for easy reading for you below. Potpourri of Information:

- Please check out the GPC website under "Christian Care" for COVID 19 updates. Information is to keep you updated.
- Wellspan is looking for people to help in multiple capacities. Please review the website listed below if you are interested in seeking a temporary position. Join our COVID-19 Hope Squad! We are currently seeking clinical and non-clinical roles for our Community COVID-19 Vaccination Sites. Volunteer and paid positions are available. Visit www.wellspan.org//COVID19Help (you will need to cut/paste) to apply or for more information.
- Packets are available with Coronavirus information on the doors at GPC. Please take a packet and share with those who might not have computer access. Spanish material available.
- Rabbit Transit has opened a long-awaited bus route between Gettysburg and Hanover. This new route will greatly benefit many Adams County residents by allowing easier access to jobs and services offered in Hanover.
- DME (Durable Medical Equipment) is available at GPC. Wheelchairs, Bedside commodes, walkers, rollators, etc. are FREE. I also have Adult diapers, dressing supplies, etc. Please reach out to me either via phone or email or call the church if you know of anyone who might need these items. I will deliver!
- If you have DME (Durable Medical Equipment) that you want to give to GPC, please contact me to see if we need that item.
- February is a time to focus on our "Cardiovascular Health." Medical conditions can increase our risk for high blood pressure. Medical conditions that affect our blood pressure are diabetes, lifestyle choices: tobacco use, unhealthy diet, obesity, physical inactivity, and increased alcohol intake. Genetics also play a role in our cardiovascular health. When unhealthy lifestyle choices and gene heredity collide, the risk increases. Other Risk factors include: Age: As we get older our blood pressure rises. 9 out of 10 Americans will develop high blood pressure during their lifetime. Race or ethnicity: These can affect our risk of elevated blood pressure. The chart below defines blood pressure parameters per the AHA (American Heart Association)

Blood Pressure	Systolic (Upper#)	Diastolic (Lower#)
Normal	Under 120	Under 80
Prehypertension	120-139	80-89
Hypertension (Stage 1)	140-159	90-99
Hypertension (Stage 2)	Above 160	Above 100
Hypertensive Crisis	Above 180	Above 110

Stop by and get your blood pressure checked on Tuesday or Thursday mornings. Contact me to make an appt.

Any chance to share your love of Jesus Christ is a link in the chain that could lead someone to meet Him. So pick up an Outreach Mask in Fellowship Hall (call the office to see if the church is open first). Or if you cannot pick it up, call or email the church office and we'll mail it to you. How easy is that?!

Sunday School Elective Lenten Series -THE BOOK OF REVELATION: Prophecy of Doom or Message of Hope? Recorded and Streamed—Dr. Buz Myers

The Book of Revelation has always been a source of controversy. No book of the New Testament has received either such ready acceptance or such resolute rejection. In some Christian circles, the Book of Revelation is "the" book of the New Testament. These persons devote all of their study time to Revelation; they carefully examine every visionary detail to determine what the book reveals about contemporary events and future happenings. In other Christian circles, however, Revelation is the most ignored book of the New Testament. These persons perceive Revelation as an obscure writing that in fact reveals nothing. They believe it to be so incomprehensible that it is not worth the time or the effort to study.

For all Christians, however, the Book of Revelation is a source of confusion and misunderstanding. Even the title causes confusion, for this book, which contains a series of revelations and visions, takes its title from the first phrase of the work: "The Revelation" (in the singular). And this is only the beginning of the confusion! The fantastic imagery and the mythological language so characteristic of Revelation are constant causes of misunderstanding and misinterpretation.

In six sessions we will consider what is surely the most confounding and most controversial book in the New Testament. What is the central message of this widely read, oftentimes misread, and too often unread book? Is that message one that should cause anxiety in the present and fear about the future, or does the Book of Revelation offer a message of hope and encouragement? Come and find out as we study together under the leadership of DR. CHARLES (BUZ) MYERS from the Department of Religious Studies at Gettysburg College. The sessions are as follows:

Sunday, February 28, 2021: "On the Lamb" (Rev. 2:1 – 5:14)

Sunday, March. 7, 2021: "Seals and Trumpets" (Rev. 6:1 - 11:19)

Sunday, March 14, 2021: "The Lady, the Beasts, and the Lamb" (Rev. 12:1 - 15:4)

Sunday, March 21, 2021: "Bowled Over in Babylon" (Rev 15:5 - 19:10)

Sunday, March 28, 2021: "No More Tears" (Rev. 19:11 - 22:21)
