Dear Church Members and Friends,

Organist and Nobel Peace Prize winner Albert Schweitzer once said, "Thank God each time when you are privileged to sit before the organ console and assist in the worship of the Almighty." Those of us sitting in the pews or worshiping at home on Sundays also give thanks to God for the blessing of our church pipe organ which has been central to the worship experience at GPC for 100 years! Even with regularly scheduled maintenance and repair, our organ now requires more extensive restoration as time has taken its toll on the many working parts of this complex instrument. Last rebuilt in 1963, our pipe organ is now exhibiting ever more frequent and significant malfunctions.



On May 2, Session approved a proposal by Columbia Organ Works to repair and restore our pipe organ beginning in mid-July. Once the organ is repaired and refurbished, it will be in "like new" condition and will enrich and enhance our worship and music at GPC for many years to come.

Some of the money to pay for the organ rebuild will come from GPC's Gifts & Memorials and Endowment Funds. But we also want each of you to have the opportunity to contribute, to help preserve organ music as part of worship at our historic church. Our goal for congregational participation is \$50,000.

Please prayerfully consider making a gift to the Organ Fund over the next few weeks during which we will be conducting a brief capital campaign to support the organ rebuild. Checks made payable to GPC with "Organ Fund" on the memo line can be sent to the church office or placed in the offering plate with the form below. You can also contribute by designating your gift electronically using the link to the Giving portal on the church website. Gifts of all amounts, small and large, will be gratefully accepted. Larger gifts of \$1,000 or more will be recognized with a plaque in Fellowship Hall.

"Let every instrument be tuned for praise." is a phrase from Hymn #264, When in Our Music God is Glorified. With your help our church organ will once again be "tuned for praise."
