As you may know, the pipe organ at GPC has served our church family for many, many years. While the early years of the pipe organ are a bit foggy, we know that the current organ was in place sometime prior to 1928 since a rebuilding of the organ occurred that year. In addition, a second rebuilding of the organ occurred in 1963 as part of larger renovations to the sanctuary.

Needless to say, that 1963 rebuilding has served our church well since it has been 58 years since any major work was undertaken on the organ! However, the organ is once again showing its age and maintenance/repair work is needed to preserve this wonderful instrument that has served our congregation for many years.

To preserve our organ for the coming generations, the GPC session recently authorized a major refurbishment which will be overtaken over the coming months. During this refurbishment period, traditional services will be worshipping through the use of piano and other instruments.

As you can imagine, there is a financial cost associated with this refurbishment and certain funds have been designated to assist with covering this expense. In addition, numerous members of our congregation have made generous dedicated gifts to help defray the cost of the refurbishment project.

## How much thought have you given to how you can help others?

One way is to donate blood every 6 months. This is a simple procedure that takes about an hour and you leave feeling satisfied that you may have helped to save a life.

Organ and tissue donation is another way to offer help. Organ donation is the process of surgically removing an organ or tissue from one person (donor) and placing it into another person (recipient). Transplants are necessary because the recipient's organ has failed or is damaged by disease or injury.

Even at death we have an opportunity to share life-giving measures with others. Thousands of people wait every day for another chance at life through organ donation. People who suffer from heart disease, kidney disease, corneal damage, and lung disease are on the transplant lists waiting for "the call."

Some common organs that can be donated include heart, heart valves, pancreas, intestines, eyes, skin, bones, liver, lungs, kidneys, middle ear, bone marrow, and connective tissue.

One donor has the potential of helping many people.

Many times, people are organ donors, and their family members are not aware of the person's desire. *If* you are an "Organ Donor," please tell your loved ones your desires.

Sometimes there is the misunderstanding that donating organs creates a cost to the donor family.

Others have misconceptions about not having an open casket at the funeral home. Neither is true. Share with your family members your reasons why you want to help others.

#### Who can be an organ donor?

People of all ages can be potential donors. When a person dies, he/she is evaluated for donor suitability based on their medical history and age.

How do I become an Organ donor?

- Sign up to be an organ donor online.
- Check "yes" for organ and tissue donation when you get or renew your driver's license, learner's permit or photo ID. This is a free service.
