Pastor Dave's Retirement Agreement

At its meeting on Sunday, Feb. 13, the Session and Pastor Dave entered into an agreement regarding the terms of his retirement. In summary, the agreement states that as of March 1, 2022 the pastoral relationship between GPC and Pastor Dave will end. That means that Pastor Dave will no longer provide any pastoral services for GPC, including participating in weddings, funerals, or baptisms, whether conducted at GPC or off-site, for at least two years after the installation of the new pastor. Following this period of separation, Pastor Dave will only participate in such ministries at the invitation of the new pastor.

This separation will create space for the congregation to let go of their pastoral connection with Pastor Dave and to connect with the new pastor.



RRR **RUTH'S HARVEST NEEDS HELP** Ruth's Harvest is a program that supplies bags of food for the weekends for in-need students in the Gettysburg School System. The children collect the bags at school at the end of the week, and take them home. Each bag holds about 18-25 small food items of varied kinds, including protein, fruits, vegetables, and snacks. Gettysburg Presbyterian Church provides volunteers on certain Mondays and Wednesdays through the school year, but we've been short lately. We meet at Lincoln Elementary School at 4:00 for about an hour, where we open up and sort food boxes. You go to the playground end of the school, and go in an open door near the back, and up a few steps to the locker room where the work is done. Plan to join us as we start the season of Lent with this special service. We'll celebrate the Lord's Supper, and we will provide an ashen reminder for our Lenten journey.

Definition of Retirement: The action or fact of leaving one's job and ceasing to work.

Yikes! I have never thought of it that way. Retirement to me means stopping one job and moving onward to another. I personally can't imagine ever retiring, well one day, when I take my last breath and head to the next leg of my journey.

I hope that we never retire. I can't imagine what Jesus would think of the actual definition.

I think it's the "ceasing to work" part that is most bothersome to me. We should never stop "ceasing to work." Rev. Paul Wilson asked me 2 weeks ago, "Why am I still here?" I said, "It's because God isn't finished with you yet, your room is ready in the Mansion, but you still have work to do." He laughed. A week later he took his last breath. He did accomplish a job during his last week of his life. He doesn't know what that specific "job" was, but I have an inkling I know. He brought someone closer in relationship to Christ and to him personally.

This week I had devotions for our staff meeting. I came across this old Irish Blessing. Perhaps it is familiar to you, or maybe this is the first time you have heard it. I thought it was fitting to share since Pastor Dave is planning to retire at the end of the month. It's not until you stop and take the time to read it slowly, that you realize just how sincere and beautiful the gesture is. This blessing was originally an Irish prayer, first written in the Irish Gaelic language, the language of Ireland. In this Celtic prayer, the wind, the sun, and the rain are mentioned, all giving a special symbolism. The <u>Celts</u> quite commonly used nature to show how God connected with his people. There is no doubt that this prayer is a heartfelt way of wishing someone a good journey, with no obstacles in their path. Of course, this could literally be a journey you're embarking on, or metaphorically be the journey of life.

This prayer has a symbolic meaning. The wind is said to represent the spirit of God, the sun representing the mercy of God, and the rain representing God's sustenance, that he provides to us. The three aspects of nature together, paint a picture of God taking us in the palm of his hand and guiding us on our journey through life. In essence, the prayer is telling us not to worry, because God "has our back" and is providing us with a path that will lead us through life, with as few challenges as possible. Of course, many Christian people believed that challenges would still exist because that is how they would build their faith. Yet, it may also have meant that they would have the strength to overcome them if they did arise. It is clear from the blessing that God is there to provide us with all this support, as we move through life. No matter what challenges you face, don't worry but be at peace knowing you are in safe hands.

May the road rise to meet you. May the wind be always at your back. May the sun shine warm upon your face; The rain fall soft upon your fields and until we meet again, May God hold you in the palm of his hand"

Greetings from your Missions and Interpretation Committee!


COVID restrictions have profoundly affected our lives in so many ways. Staying quarantined and masked, worshiping virtually, and not seeing one another regularly has also led to the cancellation of most of our mission trips outside of Adams County for the last two years. We hope this year will get us back into a "Mission Mindset" as we see the resumption of our South Carolina Mission Trip, partnering with Habitat for Humanity to bring quality housing to those in need in the Sea Island community south of Charleston. Registration

for this opportunity is open right now! Trip dates are from April 1-7, with a cost of approximately \$150 per person. No special construction skills are needed, only a willing spirit and a can-do attitude! If you think you might be interested in joining fellow GPC friends on this trip, please contact the trip Leader Jerry Cleaver at (717)-359-0419 as soon as possible. We hope many of you can join us!

Additionally, many opportunities to be of service to those in Adams County have been ongoing throughout the pandemic and continue to be great ways to get involved! Please check out the Local Missions bulletin board in Fellowship Hall to see where your interests might intersect with needs in our community. Ruth's Harvest, Gettysburg Soup Kitchen, CARES, Manos Unidas, and the Gleaning Project are just a few of the projects that are looking for your help locally.

Finally, it is with regret that I inform you that our Yucatan Mexico mission trip will once again be cancelled this year. Between COVID complications forcing masking in most interactions with locals, supply chain shortages increasing the cost of food and materials, and concern over travel interruptions, the M&I committee has determined that the best course of action is to focus on our Mexico Trip for 2023, and to start laying groundwork to resume our in-person partnership with Accion at that time. Funds that have been collected to support Accion's living facilities for young Mayan men and women attending college in Merida will be forwarded to them shortly to keep this important work moving forward.
