

Ukrainian Relief Opportunity

We have all been following the tragic stories of displaced people fleeing war in Ukraine. The images of refugees streaming from bomb-damaged cities shock us. They cause us to cry out to our Lord for peace and safety on behalf of our brothers and sisters caught in the fighting. Here are three things you can do to help...right now!

1. **PRAY**.

God hears our prayers and promises act for the good of His people! Let us all commit to lift up our Ukrainian neighbors daily

2. **GIVE**.

The Presbyterian Church (USA) has set up a direct link for donations through Presbyterian Disaster Relief. You can find this link on their website at www.pcusa.org, by clicking on the link at the top of the home page marked "Support emergency relief for those fleeing violence in Ukraine." Through trusted partners in the region, we are able to demonstrate solidarity with refugees and displaced persons through immediate gifts to the communities leading relief work and receiving refugees.

3. **STAY INFORMED**.

Listen to trusted news sources to keep up with developments in the region. Do not let your hearts be hardened or ears become deaf to the cries and needs in Ukraine and other European countries in the area.

You do not have to be a church member to participate. Thanks!!

An unexpected hospital stay or planned visit can be very overwhelming and frightening. A visit to the hospital can increase our fears and anxieties. Most of us have been to the hospital for a procedure, an Emergency room visit, illness, or surgery in our lifetime. Being prepared ahead of time can help us in our time of need.

Things we should take with us to the Emergency Department or for surgery:

- A complete list of your medications, including over-the-counter medications, and herbal supplements
- A list of our complete medical history (do not assume that your doctor "knows your history" or "it's in the chart.") The quality of your care depends on your history.
- Bring your photo ID and insurance cards

Things we shouldn't take to the hospital:

• Jewelry, credit cards, check books, and cash

Jewelry must be removed for most surgical procedures (wedding ring can be taped)
Safeguarding your possessions can be quite challenging, especially when you are sick and recovering.
This can be an unnecessary burden on you to ensure their safekeeping.

You can request:

• To meet your surgeon/physician ahead of your scheduled date for surgery

Some people are meeting their surgeon for the first time before their surgery. You will want to ask about incision size, how much pain to expect, how will pain be controlled, and what restrictions you will have. Another question to ask is if you will need a blood transfusion. If you want to donate your own, these arrangements must be completed ahead of time.

To help you with compiling your Health information I have made a booklet for all your family members. I have one for my husband and I that I keep with me. I have had to use it multiple times. My own personal health record has decreased my stress knowing that the information can be handed to a medical professional to obtain the correct and up to date information.

In an emergency, we often can't remember the important information that we need to share with the medical team.
