# **GREAT NEWS FROM KENYA!** Your support = positive change

When we received the news of the death of the only dairy cow at the Scofield School and Orphanage in Suna, Kenya, GPC Missions started a program called "Help Paint the Cow Red" to raise funds for a replacement. Your response was an overwhelming blessing! The goal of \$500 was quickly eclipsed and total donations reached \$2,250 PLUS a special gift of \$2000 to help restore full functioning of the solar lighting system at the compound. When combine with funds raised by another supporting church in NC, the impact has been life-changing!

Ben Okello writes, "Dear friends, may we take this opportunity to thank you very much for your support. With your generous help we were able to buy two dairy cows and one bull. We also bought six chickens and two goats! This is just wonderful! Maybe God allowed our cow to die so that we could receive what he has now given us. The children prayed and fasted for three days. They cried so much that God's heart was touched to pour out blessings upon us. Thank you for supporting these vulnerable, destitute children. We currently have 41 children in different universities in Kenya [and 75 children living at the school/orphanage]. Scofield is vastly represented with very bright children! We thank God for all our supporters who have been working tirelessly toward this achievement. Your help, support and prayers are greatly appreciated."

In addition to the new residents at Scofield, Ben was able to re-hire the teachers that were not able to be paid previously, and has added two new solar panels and batteries to renew the lighting system in the compound! Thank you for your donations, your prayers and your interest in Ben and Emily Okello, their children, and their Christian witness and work in Suna, Kenya! Our gracious Lord took our humble effort at GPC to a whole new level, and has blessed the Scofield School with real change! Thank you.

The events framed by Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and his resurrection are some of the most dramatic and theologically important of the entire scriptural narrative. These days feature not only the drama of the triumphal entry, trial, last supper, and crucifixion but also poignant prayers and prophetic teachings of our Lord.

John's gospel devotes eight of its twenty-one chapters to this week alone!

The week begins with Passion/Palm Sunday and ends with the "three days" (also called the *Triduum*, from sunset on Thursday to sunset on Easter Day), the period during which we mark Jesus' trial, death, and resurrection. (*Worship Sourcebook*, second edition, 2013)

While this week can cause dissonant chords to rise within our souls as we move through the week's events, may we be reminded that from dissonance comes growth and we cannot celebrate Christ's resurrection without bearing witness to his death.

Join us this Holy Week & consider who you could invite, for this journey is meant to be shared.

**Colon cancer** is also known as **colorectal cancer**. Colon cancer is when abnormal cells grow out of control in the lower part of your intestine. When found early, it can be treated often with a good outcome.

*Symptoms:* Usually none until after it has begun to spread. Some people complain of belly pain, blood in their stools or very dark stools. Usually, a change in your bowel habits (like frequent stools or not emptying completely).

*Causes:* Most colon cancers begin with polyps, small growths inside the colon or rectum. They are very common and most do not turn into cancer. Screenings are very important!

#### Types of Colon screenings:

- \* A colonoscopy is a screening test that is a lighted scope that shows the entire colon.
- \* Stool tests (checking your stool for signs of cancer including Fecal immunochemical test (FIT), and fecal occult blood test (FOBT).
- \* Sigmoidoscopy: a lighted scope shows only the lower part of your intestines.
- \* Computed tomographic colonography also known as a Virtual colonoscopy.

#### How is colon cancer treated?

Colon polyps and tissue samples are removed during a colonoscopy or sigmoidoscopy. Colon cancer is almost always treated with surgery. If the cancer has spread into the walls of the colon or further, radiation and chemotherapy may be part of the treatment plan.

#### **Prevention:**

Maintain a healthy weight Eat a variety of vegetables, fruits, legumes, fish, poultry, whole grains Limit your alcohol intake Stay active No smoking (people who smoke have a higher rate of cancer than non-smokers)

#### How often should I have a colonoscopy?

Current practice is every 10 years unless an abnormality is found during the procedure or there is family history of colon cancer and then you will be given an earlier timeframe for repeat testing. **Regular screening saves lives!!**




