#### "Let our Faith be More than Anthems"

RAP

We sang this song on Sunday at the Contemporary Worship Service and I was moved into an emotional place I rarely find myself on Sunday mornings. As a pastor, it is difficult for me to both lead you in worship and worship myself, and yet from time to time the Spirit moves and confronts me with a truth: our faith must be more than anthems.

This song was sung right after Bonnie Wright shared a story about her dear friends who took a trip to Israel just before Hamas attacked. She shared that they had made it to Jordan and were safe, with all praise and thanksgiving to God.

And yet we know so many did not make it to safety. Now, as bombs land on the Gaza Strip, estimates of 180,000 people have been displaced. The conflict between Israel and Palestine is decades old and beyond nuanced, and difficult to wrap our minds around.

When the way forward is hard to conceptualize, when the problem is too large for simple solutions, we must remember: we believe that Jesus conquered death. We believe in the resurrection. If this is true, and we affirm that it is, then how much more so is it true that with prayer, God will help us all to find a resolution to conflict everywhere? Amen, we know God will.

And we also know that prayer is an action verb. Let your faith be more than anthems. Right now, if you wish to support those innocent festival goers who were attacked, if you wish to support children and families in Gaza who no longer have access to food, water, electricity, there are several international organizations that are doing their best to work with innocents on either side of this conflict:

To help humanitarian efforts in Gaza:

Doctors without Borders (quickly running out of medical supplies) Egyptian Red Crescent (medical supplier for Gaza) Mercy Corps (food and water for Gaza) Palestine Children's Relief Fund (food, clothing, medication)

To help humanitarian efforts in Israel: The Women's Zionist Organization of America (hospital in Jerusalem - treating soldiers and civilians) The American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee (families, children, elderly) IsraAID (Israeli based humanitarian group) Magen David Adom (National EMS Organization)

The End-of-Life Committee (an affiliate of Healthy Adams County) is holding an Interactive Resource Fair: "Preparing Through Life for End of Life," on Sunday October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2023 from 12:00-3:00 pm at Trinity United Church of Christ in Gettysburg. Representatives from the committee will be on hand to answer questions about the following topics: Advanced Directives, pre-planning for funerals, home care and hospice, grief support, non-medical providers, palliative care and financial planning. Whether you are a caregiver concerned about a loved one, parents who want to plan early to make sure your children are taken care of and do not have to make tough decisions if something should happen to you, or individuals who have questions regarding any of the topics above, this is the event to attend.

In addition to being able to ask questions at the tables, there will be three presentations on three different topics: 12:30-1:00 – Legal Considerations; 1:15-1:45 – Care Provider Panel; 2:00-2:30 – Pre-Planning for Funerals. Each presentation will last about 15 minutes and then there will be 15 minutes for questions.

The event is free and a light lunch will be available. Every attendee will receive a ticket for door prizes and there will be giveaways and resource information.



Have you ever wanted to visit the school/orphanage we support in Kenya? Gale Pollock, an Elder of the church, is planning a visit there in the summer of 2024 and wondered if anyone would like to go with her? Ben and Emily have been encouraging a visit from GPC members for many years...this could be your chance! Gale is planning to fly into Nairobi, Kenya and from there to the smaller regional airport near the orphanage. The group would be met by Ben, who would escort us to Scofield School in Suna, Kenya where we would stay in their guest lodge. He would like us to stay for 3-5 days. Don't speak the language? Not to worry! In Kenya people speak both English and Swahili, so most of the children and staff will be able to talk with us and we with them! Following our visit to Scofield, the group could visit one of the National Park/Reserves to see the wildlife.

Gale has information from the State Department and the Centers for Disease Control—there are both medical and societal challenges to prepare for, but she is comfortable planning and making the trip. 
