## The Full Stop

The "full stop" is a period. It's the small dot at the end of a sentence, marking the end of the sentence. It can also be used to stop an abbreviation - such as Rev. McClure. It also is "used interjectionally to emphasize the finality of the preceding statement." There's nothing more that comes afterwards. If we were to ask what is the most important Christian virtue, or what is the most important thing for a Christian to focus on, the *full stop* is love. It's the most important thing without any doubt or question.

In the Greek, there are a number of words for love - romantic love, family love, friendly love, but the *love* we are speaking about right now is the one called "agape" love. It's the unconditional love that God has for us and the one Christ demonstrates, radically, through his mission and ministry in the world, and it's the one we are called to reflect. It's the love we were created with. It's the love John speaks about. It's the love Paul writes about.

C.S. Lewis, in his book the Four Loves, talks about agape love as a love that does not directly benefit the self - it's a divine love that allows us, as human beings, to love that which is not naturally loveable, to love completely and absolutely. There is no aim or objective with agape love - it simply is. It is not boisterous, or

loud on the emotional spectrum, it's not an easy or simple thing, it doesn't have the warm fuzzy feeling inside that we might hope for, when say we love our parents, or our partners, or our children, or our family - it's a love that undercurrents the entire human experience. Agape love connects us all together because we are made from it ourselves.

It is the greatest commandment. To love. To love God with everything. All of you - your physical activity, your spiritual activity, your emotional activity - is called to love God. And secondly, you are called to love your neighbor as yourself.

37 Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' 38 This is the first and greatest commandment. 39 And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' 40 All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

But notice verse 40. Read it again. If we could add to "full stop," in this case, it's verse 40. Another way of thinking about this verb is "suspended." The whole bible sits on top of this agape love - you must learn to do this in your discipleship before you will be successful at anything else, and you must come back, again and again to the greatest commandments: agape love for God, agape love for everyone.

- 3. Be thinking about the Bake Sale that will happen on Dec 10th as well!


