# **Thanksgiving**

Recently, in my tech study group, another minister in town, Rev. Jeremiah Herbert, was talking to me about what his church was doing through the month of November. He shared that he felt that our world moves right from Halloween into Christmas, and we have been jumping over Thanksgiving. I thought to myself, "wow – I've felt that way for years but never put it like that." The best "aha!" moments come when the information was already in you, but veiled or obscured, and someone comes along and says the right thing the right way and opens you up.

We do jump right over Thanksgiving – at least in comparison to the powerhouses of Holidays like Halloween and Christmas. I mean, they *sell*, don't they? Decorations (my Halloween lights are still up – guilty), gifts, candy, themes. It's a lot! Just go into any store in town right now and you'll find the not so subtle hints of Christmas. But what about Thanksgiving?

My friend Jeremiah shared the passage they are studying throughout November and it's stuck with me all week, and I want to share it with you. It's from 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18:

16 Rejoice always,

pray without ceasing,

18 give thanks in all circumstances;
for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.


