Happy New Year!

What's your New Year's resolution? Mine this year is to let go of some of that self-doubt I carry around with me. Hear these words from Micah 7:19:

He will again have compassion on us; he will tread our iniquities underfoot. You will cast all our sins into the depths of the sea.

Growing up my father always would say, after we did something wrong (and got punished for it!), that we would "throw it into the sea of God." Whatever it was, once it was done and over with, we would move on together. In other words, we got to start over. I carried that with me all my life and continue to carry it with me today.

And it was during our Micah bible study class that I learned my dad's statement was actually Scripture – I always thought it was just one of his sayings. Imagine my surprise! Four years of seminary, a decade of ministry, and only now learning this saying my dad used for years comes from the minor prophet Micah.

As I think about my new year's resolution this year, I am thinking about my dad's expression that turned out to be Scripture: throw it into the sea of God. What things am I carrying around that I need to part with this year? What needs to be thrown into the sea of God as I move into the New Year? I can answer easily: my self-doubt, my lack of confidence, my worry about not being the best.

I wonder what it is that you might need to throw into the sea of God? What heavy burdens have you been lugging around this past year that you could shed into God's sea? Whatever those burdens are, let the prophet Micah remind you of a few truths about our God: God pardons you, God forgives you, God does not stay angry but delights in mercy, God shows you compassion, God is faithful to you, God loves you, God will keep his covenant with you.

Remember: God is big enough to handle your burdens – so unload. Give it away. Be free from those heavy loads, and ready to face a new year full of the assurance of God's promises to you.

May you each have a Happy New Year.

Each of us can help save a life! How? By recognizing the warning signs and symptoms of a Heart Attack. A Heart attack, aka a "Myocardial Infarction," can develop in either sex, at any age, time, or place.

What is a Heart Attack? A Heart attack is a serious, life-threatening medical emergency that occurs when the blood supply to the heart is *suddenly* blocked.

Signs and Symptoms: A person can develop more than one sign/symptom.

- Chest discomfort (can be described as pressure, tightness, squeezing, sharp, stabbing, heaviness of the chest)
- Pain can feel like it's spreading from chest to arms, usually in the left, but can affect both, jaw, neck, back and stomach
- Sweating
- · Lightheaded, dizziness
- Nausea
- Vomiting
- · Shortness of breath
- Weakness
- Coughing
- Wheezing
- · Anxious feeling
- Physical appearance (persons color is ashen, gray, pale, just doesn't look right)

A Swedish study published in the British Medical Journal in 2018 found that an average of 50 heart attacks occurred every day, but this number rose to 69 on Christmas Eve.

If you think someone is having a heart attack, call 911 right away. Do not drive them to the hospital regardless of how close you live to the nearest facility.

If the person stops breathing, and or the heart stops beating, initiate CPR and get the AED (Automated External Defibrillator).

Sun., Jan. 21 at 7PM in the MacAskill Room


Trip is available for adults and youth who have completed 9th grade.
