As Jesus Did, So Do We

In the Gospel of John, during the last supper in chapter 13, Jesus washes the disciples feet:

ΑΡ

"[Jesus]⁴ rose from supper. He laid aside his outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around his waist. ⁵ Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was wrapped around him."

Peter resists this at first, but after Jesus explains the importance, Peter asks to be washed from head to toe! But Jesus reminds him it's just the feet. And it's the act of serving that's important:

^{"12b} 'Do you understand what I have done to you? ¹³ You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am. ¹⁴ If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. ¹⁵ For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you. ¹⁶ Truly, truly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him."

On March 28th, at our Maundy Thursday service, we are going to do as Jesus did. We are going to break bread together in the Fellowship Hall - fresh baked Challah bread! Baked with love from many hands at our church. We are going to drink wine and grape juice together. We are going to sit at table and commune.
