"The Pastor's Page"

As I sit at my desk with the trolly running back and forth (you really need to visit me in my office if you do not know what this means...) I cannot believe how fast May is flying by. Mothers' Day & Youth Sunday have just been celebrated, in our home we have two graduations (well, three if we count Pre-K) next week. So much to be thankful for, yet we are also mourning the loss of one of our neighbors to cancer. The many events in our lives got me thinking about one of the stained-glass window in the chapel of Gettysburg Hospital which has this verse...

"To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven..." Ecclesiastes 3:1

King Solomon writes that there is an appropriate time for everything, the unpleasant as well as pleasant experiences. This is not just a description of what happens in life; it is a description of what God sends. Times and seasons have been predestined by God who has scheduled each day of our lives. So often, we think that we know what would be best for ourselves and humanity at large, and our own perceived ideas are often reflected in our prayers... and yet the desires of our heart and our urgent pleadings to the Lord, too often conflict with God's wider will for our lives and God's greater desire and destiny for us.

Ecclesiastes 3:1 is a simple, yet timely reminder, that we are to live by faith in the Word of Truth, and to trust God's judgement in all things, for He sends blessings on the just and unjust alike, and God takes our foolish schemes, and rebellious actions, and turns them to God's greater glory, in order to fulfil God's ultimate plan and purpose, which is that Christ is all in all.

It was King Solomon who saw that God has established specific times and predetermined seasons, which influence the affairs of our own individual lives and affects everything that takes place, down throughout history. This cyclical pattern was set in motion by God, when God spoke the world into being. It was then, that in God's wisdom that Our Creator put in motion a series of unchangeable, natural laws, which were determined by God, and which have an impact on every area of our own lives, as well as the wider world and universe.

In the beginning, the Lord said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the heavens to separate the day from the night." (Genesis 1:4) He placed the sun and the moon in the sky of heaven, for signs and for seasons and for days and years. He called them into being, to govern the day, and to govern the night. When God called Israel out of Egypt to be God's chosen people, God also set some appointed times and seasons for them, together with feast days and sabbath days. God ordered holy convocations on which to present offerings by fire to the Lord. Burnt offerings and grain offerings, sacrifices and drink offerings, each at certain appointed times.

This caused Solomon to reach the understanding that God has made everything beautiful in its own time, and that the Lord has placed eternity in the heart of every-person. Solomon realized that in God's economy there is an appointed time for everything, and a scheduled time for every event under heaven. A time to be born and a time to die; a time to plant and a time to gather; a time to kill and a time to heal; a time to tear down and a time to build up. Solomon identified times for all sorts of contrasting events that continue to impact the lives of everyone under the sun.

As we enter these new seasons, be they in church, in school, in work, in family, or in life, we should be mindful that God has reasons for what we experience. As my dear friend John David Bryant would often say, "We Plan, God Laughs." May we all find the Joy and Purpose of the season we are in.

May is Skin Cancer Awareness Month!

Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer in the United States. Look for free screenings throughout your community.

Be Sun Smart! Sun exposure occurs whenever you are outside. As warmer weather approaches, we want to be gardening, fishing, hiking, swimming, doing water activities, etc. Remember ultraviolet rays (UV) are present even on cloudy days. Everyone is at risk for skin cancer. Protect yourself from the sun.

Slip! Slop! Slap! and Wrap!

Slip on a shirt to protect your skin.

Slop on sunscreen. Choose a broad spectrum with a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 30. Say *YES to minerals*. Natural minerals reflect UV rays to protect from burning and aging. Because minerals are not absorbed, they are safe and gentile on sensitive skin. Examples are Zinc oxide and titanium dioxide.

Slap on a hat! Shade your face, neck, and ears.

Wrap on sunglasses. Protect your eyes from UV rays.

Limit exposure between 11am and 3pm when UV rays are the strongest!
