We will be collecting items for "Warrior Walk-In"

Warrior Walk-In at Gettysburg High School is a free-to-use thrift shop for students in need of school supplies, clothing, toiletries, or snack-type foods. The organization is run by students and teachers in the school. It is designed to provide an available "stash" of supplies for students who find that "life isn't falling in place" for them.

Needed items include: clothing for both boys and girls, feminine hygiene products, toothbrushes, tooth paste, floss, hair brushes, individually packaged crackers, cookies or candy.

Associate Pastor Nominating Committee

Just a brief update on where the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC) that you elected on June 2nd is in the process of finding a new Associate Pastor.

Our first step was to meet with Kristal Smith from the Carlisle Presbytery Commission on Ministry to go over the resources and process that we will need to follow in our search. In simplest terms, we begin by compiling a full description of our church, mission statement, and a description of our needs, known as a Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP). Our committee has been meeting on a weekly basis and we are early in the process of compiling our MDP.

Once completed, the MDP will be submitted to Presbytery for posting in their Opportunity Search, a nation-wide internet system that makes our documents available to potential candidates. When candidates are interested in exploring a possible match with us, they enter their Pastor Discernment Profile (PDP) into the system. If the system considers these PDP's to be potentially good matches with our MDP, we will be notified and can then begin the review/interview process. Unfortunately, we are searching in a "buyers' market" where there are more churches looking for Associates than there are Associates seeking a new church. Presbytery tells us that the full process can take us up to 18 months to complete.

There is a lot of work to be done and, as we make progress, we will provide you with periodic updates.

South Dakota Trip

Several former South Dakota mission trip veterans continue to be in touch with our Lakota friends on the reservation. Although as a group we have not been to the reservation in several years, there continues to be great need among the Lakota people. A small group is planning a trip to the reservation with donations of children's cold weather coats, sheets and blankets. While there the group plans to assess needs and opportunities for future trips.

September is Prostate Cancer Awareness Month

Prostate cancer is the 2^{nd} most common type of cancer (other than non-melanoma skin cancer) for men. It is the 2^{nd} leading cause of cancer deaths.

What is a prostate and where is it located? It is a small gland, approx. the size of a walnut that surrounds the urethra (a tube that empties urine from the bladder). It is a part of the male reproductive system located just below the bladder and in front of the rectum. Per the National Cancer Institute, almost all prostate cancers are adenocarcinomas. These cancers begin in cells that make and release mucus and other fluids.

What are the symptoms of Prostate cancer? Often has no early symptoms. Sometimes it causes men to urinate more often or have a weaker flow of urine. But these symptoms can also result from benign prostate conditions.

Screening for Prostate Cancer: A simple blood test, **PSA** (Prostate specific Antigen) can often catch the disease before it spreads. An exam by your PCP also is an indicator.

Who is at risk for Prostate Cancer: Prostate cancer is more common in older men, family history of Prostate cancer, and higher incidence in African American decent.






Men's Interfaith Luncheon
