Benedictions

There are a lot of things I get to do in worship that I really enjoy: leading prayers, singing, and preaching come to mind. But the thing I do in worship that I might enjoy most of all is the Benediction at the end of the service! Benediction is another word for a blessing. So I am announcing God's blessing on all who are present. Often, after I have struggled to proclaim what the scripture demands of us during the sermon, it is wonderful to be able to simply proclaim God's blessing on us all.

I typically use two benedictions. The first was first spoken by Moses' brother Aaron in his role as priest over Israel: "The Lord bless you and keep you. The Lord make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you. The Lord lift up the light of his countenance upon you and give you peace." (Numbers 6:24-26) It is a simple blessing that recognizes God's good actions on our

The second contains a challenge as well as a blessing: "Now go from this place to love the Lord and love the people, to serve the Lord and serve the people. And may the blessing of God Almighty, Father Son, and Holy Spirit, descend upon you and remain in your heart forever." I love the link between loving and serving God and loving and serving each other.

So, next time worship is ending, and the final song has been sung, rather than gather up all your things, focus on the benediction and experience the Good News of God's grace for us!



Divorce Care Support

Gettysburg Presbyterian Church is pleased to begin offering DivorceCare support services through its Stephen Ministry. Divorce and separation are painful and stressful, and people going through them can feel very isolated.

DivorceCare is a nationally recognized support group that meets weekly to help people experiencing separation and/or divorce face the many challenges facing them. DivorceCare is a faith-based program, which runs in 13 week cycles. Each meeting incorporates a video seminar with top experts on divorce and recovery, followed by time spent as a group discussing the video and talking about the challenges that the members of the group may be facing.

The first cohort at GPC for DivorceCare begins on Sunday, August 27 from 5:30 to 7 in the Eisenhower Lounge, and will meet every Sunday for 13 weeks at the same time. The groups will be facilitated by Dr. Susan Tassin, and require pre-registration.

The cost is \$15, and includes a workbook (confidential financial aid available upon request). Childcare is available upon request, let us know when registering for the group.

Adams County Habitat for Humanity (ACHH) is asking for your help in locating families or individuals who would qualify for a "Hand Up" in improving their housing situation. ACHH partners with qualifying families or individuals who would like to participate in the pride of owning their own home. Basic requirements include 500 donated hours (250 for single parent families) working with the Habitat volunteers on their home or that of another. One half of those hours can be donated by friends and family. A Habitat owner must qualify with an acceptable credit and employment history and sufficient income to make an interest free mortgage payment. They also must have been a resident in Adams County for a year. The upper income limit for family of four is \$58,550 and \$46,850 for a family of 2.
