Calendar of Giving

Gettysburg C.A.R.E.S.

Gettysburg C.A.R.E.S. (Combined Area Resources Emergency Shelter) offers overnight shelter in area churches for homeless individuals and families from October through April. C.A.R.E.S. guests are screened for substance abuse and criminal records before being accepted in the program. Churches provide sleeping space for two week periods, from 8:30 in the evening until 7 in the morning. C.A.R.E.S. also operates an intake/resource center, 117 York St., which is open during the day so that guests have access to showers, laundry facilities, computers and professional counselors to help them find more permanent housing, healthy food sources, and medical and mental health services. 2020 is GPC's 9th year as a shelter location. We will host December 22—January 5. Additionally, GPC will provide transportation in the church to Great Conewago Church. Volunteers are needed for both.

October – April: Be a C.A.R.E.S. Host or Overnight Volunteer. Host Volunteers and Overnight Volunteers are needed each night the shelter is open.

A training session is required for all new volunteers. Dates for volunteer trainings will be announced in the Grapevine.

Habitat for Humanity

GPC has been a Covenant Church with **Habitat for Humanity** for 25 years. This ministry builds houses for people who otherwise would not be able to afford to own their own homes through access to no interest loans. Those chosen to be Habitat home owners must help build their new home (called "sweat equity") along with the Habitat volunteers or help in the construction of another's home. New homeowners are provided counseling on family finances, budgeting and other skills to ensure successful home ownership.

How you can help: Contact Bob Remaley (717-642-8334). Volunteers with construction skills as well as general helpers are needed for work days scheduled periodically throughout the spring, summer, and fall. Also needed are volunteers who can provide beverages and food for the workers.

Gettysburg Community Soup Kitchen

Once a month GPC provides soup for lunch at the **Gettysburg Community Soup Kitchen**. This beef vegetable soup is made from a recipe and placed in 10 one-quart containers, labeled and frozen for delivery. Interested volunteers are assigned a month and provided the containers and recipe with plenty of time to prepare and deliver to the church. There is also the opportunity for special food preparation when needed.

Adopt - a - Camp Migrant Ministry

GPC has adopted a **migrant labor camp** through the Fruitbelt Farmworkers Christian Ministry. "Our camp" is located in Bendersville and houses about 40 Spanish speaking men who arrive in late August and stay until the apple harvest concludes in October. Some stay later for pruning.

Each year we provide welcome/health kits for the men. We also visit the camp, building relationships to show the farm workers that we value them for the important role they play in our local economy and also because they are our brothers in Christ.

For this cross-cultural experience, Spanish language skills are not required but are a bonus. More important is an open heart and concern for one's fellow man.
