Gettysburg C.A.R.E.S. Report

From Monday, December 30 through Sunday, January 12, GPC welcomed Gettysburg C.A.R.E.S. guests each evening from 8:30 in the evening until 7 AM the next morning. The number of guests ranged between 17 and 29, with most nights above 20. Seven children came regularly with their moms or dads. The lower level Sunday School rooms and the MacAskill Room served as sleeping quarters during some of the coldest nights so far this winter for people who would otherwise have had nowhere to stay, except perhaps in their cars. The guests regularly expressed their gratitude for the chance to come in out of the cold and sleep in a warm and safe place.

A number of people helped the shelter to run smoothly during its two week stay. Our custodians, Tracey Stone and Scott McPherson, went above and beyond, not only keeping the rooms clean, but rearranging furniture and other equipment when they were needed for other purposes during the day. Scott and Lou Nyiri cleared the sidewalks of snow and ice for guests who were on foot. Rev. Dr. Brooks Schramm is Professor of Biblical Studies at the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Gettysburg. As you may recall, last April Brooks presented a series on "The Dead Sea Scrolls". It was a fascinating series, enthusiastically attended by many church members. Brooks has agreed to return to GPC next month for a new series on "The Psalms".

Professor Brooks Scramm has taught Bible, Hebrew and particularly courses related to the Old Testament at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg since 1994. He received a BA in German and History from Texas A & M University in 1979, an M. Div. from Wartburg Theological Seminary in 1984, and a Ph.D. in Hebrew Bible from the University of Chicago in 1993.

BIBLE - A - THON

Our church is offering a "Bible-A-Thon" for children in Kindergarten through Grade 5. This program is similar to the Knowledge-A-Thon held at local elementary schools.

On February 16 and 23, the children in Kindergarten, Grade 1, and Grade 2 will be given a list of 50 Bible questions and answers; children in Grades 3,4, and 5, a list of 100. Then on Sundays, March 2, 9, and 16, adults and teens will be available during Sunday School and church to sit with each child individually and see if they can answer each question. Those children who score 80% or better will be presented with a ribbon and invited to a party at the church on March 23.

Dinners for Seven or Eight

The goal of these dinners is to provide church members an opportunity to enjoy fellowship at three casual, adult-only dining experiences. If getting to know twenty-one to twenty-four church members in this type of setting sounds appealing, then Dinners for Seven or Eight is for you. Deadline to register is February 23, 2014, after which a schedule will be made designating one person to host a dinner to include six or seven other GPC members in their home (you choose if you wish to host). The host prepares a main course and informs the members in their group so they will bring an appropriate side dish (side dishes are assigned to each participant on the schedule – vegetable, salad or dessert). Dinners will occur in March, April and May.

Sometimes we have more participants than hosts, so if you wish, you may host more than one dinner. You may also be a substitute who is called if a regular participant runs into calendar problems and cannot attend a particular month's meal. Substitutes then bring the side dish of the individual or couple you are replacing (i.e. salad, vegetable or dessert).


We encourage you to use the special envelope to pay your per capita expense so we don't need to take it out of our operating budget. Thank you!

The Life of Our Lord

by Charles Dickens Illustrations by Rachel Taft-Dixon Written 1850 Published 1934

What a great book for children and adults! Charles Dickens authored this book for his children and never intended it to be published. It was written right after David Copperfield was published. Dickens wrote this as a letter to his children about his religious beliefs. I know you might be a little skeptical but he evidently had his own personal beliefs about the life of Jesus.

It is beautifully written and illustrated. I thought the illustrations stole the book. It begins at the birth of Christ and ends at the crucifixion. I found it a quick read but very telling about the time period it was written in. Mr. Dickens is actually telling a story to his children. I can just picture him gathering all the children around and reading a chapter or two a night before a roaring fire. Afterwards, there would be discussions and maybe a prayer.

When Charles Dickens passed away in 1870. his wife and children were true to his wishes and did not have the book published. Once Mrs. Dickens died, the book fell into her sister's hands and she also kept it from being published. It finally found its way to belong to Sir Henry Dickens, Charles's youngest child. Upon Sir Henry's death in 1933, his wife and children were instructed in the will to decide what they thought should happen to the book. Should it stay solely in the family or be published to share with the world. By individual vote, they decided to have it published. So, in 1933, Associated Newspapers LTD in London published the book for us all to enjoy. Then in 1945, Simon & Schuster published the book in the United States.

I hope you are able to drop by the GPC Bookmobile in Fellowship Hall and take a look at <u>The Life of Our Lord</u>. It will be well worth your time!
