Speaker: Dr. Tracy McKenzie will speak on "The Almighty Has His Own Purposes': Learning from Lincoln about Democracy, Patriotism, and Faith."

Dr. McKenzie taught for twenty-two years at the University of Washington, where he held the Donald Logan Chair in American History, was a fellow in the UW Teaching Academy, and a recipient of the university's Distinguished Teaching Award. In 2010 he joined the faculty of Wheaton College (IL), where he serves as professor and chair of the Department of History. A specialist in the history of the American Civil War, he is the author, among other works, of *Lincolnites and Rebels: A Divided Town in the American Civil War*, the 2007 recipient of the Fletcher Pratt Literary Award for best non-fiction work on the Civil War.
